#### THE LAST MEETING

#### Sept. 17 • No. 21 Cal 22, ESU 19

EAST STROUDSBURG - All-America wide receiver Thomas Mayo caught a 75-yard TD pass on 4thand-10 with 3:12 left as No. 21 California escaped Eiler-Martin Stadium with a 22-19 win.

Mayo, a transfer from Concord (WV), had 12 catches for 201 yards, and came up big after QB Peter Lalich (29-45, 389 yards, 2 TD, 2 Int.) threw three straight incompletions deep in Vulcan territory.

Cal had two interceptions and forced a turnover on downs on ESU's last three possessions. Erik Harris had the pick before the game-winning score, Darnell Harding had the next and the Warriors lost the ball on downs at their 25 with 19 seconds left

ESU came within inches of upsetting the sixtime PSAC West champions thanks to a defense that held Cal to 1-for-7 in the red zone. Cody Nuzzo missed three field goals in the 1st half and ESU had a forced fumble at the goal line, a 4th-down stand at the 18 and another goal line stand - all in the 4th quarter.

The Warriors trailed 14-3 at halftime before scoring 16 straight points in the third quarter to take a 19-14 lead. R-Sr. QB **Ray Wagner** hit So. WR **Dusty Reed** for a 4-yard TD pass, R-So. K **John Schubert** made a 35-yard field goal, and So. FB **Darius Jackson** plunged in from one yard out to give ESU its first lead of the game with 2:19 left in the 3rd

The defense forced turnovers in three of Cal's first eight plays of the 2nd half. R-Sr. LB **Taylor Cave** had an interception to set up an 8-play, 45-yard drive and Reed's TD catch, Cave recovered a fumble after a bad snap that led to the field goal, and Mayo fumbled after a 25-yard catch before the go-ahead drive.

Wagner was 24-for-44 for 263 yards, a TD and 3 interceptions to give him 961 yards through the first three games – the third-most passing yards in three games in school history. #### ESU Football Adopts State-of-the-Art Helmet Sensor Technology to Better Monitor Player Head Impacts

Aug. 30, 2017

ESU's football program is the first in the PSAC to adopt Riddell's InSite Impact Response System - the latest in head impact monitoring technology from the world's leading helmet manufacturer. ESU is one of 12 programs, among 170 in NCAA Division II, to utilize InSite during the 2017 season. The helmets for all 87 Warriors are equipped with InSite.

Riddell InSite is a football helmet-based sensor technology that alerts sideline staff when a player experiences a significant single impact or multiple impacts during a game or practice. The latest software – ISPM 3.0 – delivers more robust information about player head impacts including the location of the impact. It also offers new training opportunities based on data trends by player, and highlights East Stroudsburg's commitment to protecting its players not only through technique, but through technology.

"We are committed to using available technology to help keep our players as safe as possible on the field, both in practice and competition," said **Denny Douds**, ESU football head coach. "InSite allows our coaches and athletic trainers to have an extra set of eyes that helps them better monitor the action on the field. InSite also helps us identify players that are using less than optimal techniques and re-teach them. We feel this is an important investment in the health and safety of our football student-athletes here at ESU."

"The InSite helmet technology is another valuable resource that aids our athletic training staff in safeguarding our student-athletes," said **Colleen Shotwell, Ph.D., ATC**, ESU's coordinator of athletic training services. "The system provides objective measures of the impact and location of contact, which will allow us to more accurately monitor our student-athletes throughout their careers."

InSite was developed based on Riddell's Head Impact Telemetry System (HITS) and Sideline Response System (SRS), a technology that has analyzed more than 5 million impacts since 2003. This integrated technology fits into the liner of a Riddell helmet and is used to monitor players and alert the sideline to significant head impacts sustained during a football game or practice.

- **Jimmy Terwilliger**, the 2005 Harlon Hill Trophy winner as a junior at ESU, is in his 3rd year on the Warriors' coaching staff as defensive backs coach
- $\bullet$  He joins his father,  $\textbf{Mike Terwilliger}, \mathsf{ESU}$  's offensive coordinator, on Denny Douds ' staff
- Mike Terwilliger enters his 39th year as assistant coach after 4 years as ESU's starting QB from 1974-77 Douds' first 4 years as head coach
- Mike was a 2-time 1st team All-PSAC East selection, leading ESU to a 30-4-1 record, the 1975 PSAC championship (10-0) and a tie in the 1976 State Game (9-0-1)
- Jimmy was 36-12 in 4 years as ESU's starting QB from 2003-06 and is the only 4-time 1st team All-PSAC East QB in conference history
- $\bullet$  He set 18 DII and 2 NCAA all-division records, tying the all-time mark with 148 career TD passes and setting DII records for passing yards (14,350) and total offense (16,064), among other standards.

- $\bullet$  The Warriors had their winningest decade in school history in the 2000's, going 77-34 for a .694 winning percentage
- They had 9 winning seasons in 10 years, made 3 NCAA Playoff appearances (2004, 2005, 2009), won PSAC East titles in 2002 and 2003, and had a school-record 11 wins in 2005
- ESU has an all-time record of 479-331-19 (.589)

#### **QB FAMILIES UNDER DOUDS**

The Soltes (Matt and Andy), Terwilligers (Mike and Jimmy) and Marshalls (Brian and Matt) have all thrown TD passes for the Warriors under Douds.

#### Soltes

Andy Soltes' only career TD was a 73-yard pass to Scott Benoit that put the Warriors ahead in the 4th quarter of a 17-9 win at West Chester in 1982. He suffered an injury in the spring game the following year.

Matt's 5th career TD was a 33-yard pass to Tim Wilson to beat West Chester, 35-28, on October 6, 2012. Matt was a 3-time Harlon Hill Trophy candidate, finished t-5th in the national voting in 2015 and threw 126 career TD passes (2nd in PSAC history, t-2nd in DII history).

#### <u>Terwilligers</u>

Mike Terwilliger, ESU's offensive coordinator, was QB for Douds' first four years (1974-77) and has been an assistant coach ever since. He led ESU to a 30-4-1 record in 35 starts and threw 33 TD passes.

His son, Jimmy, ESU's defensive backs coach, was a 4-year Harlon Hill candidate from 2003-06, the 2005 Harlon Hill Award winner, and tied the NCAA all-division record with 148 TD passes. Jimmy was 36-12, starting all 48 games, and led the Warriors to the NCAA DII semifinals in 2005.

#### **Marshalls**

Brian Marshall was the Warriors' QB in 1981, under Terwilliger's tutelage, and threw 5 TD passes.

His son, Matt, was a two-year starter, led ESU to the 2009 NCAA Playoffs and threw 61 TD passes (4th in school history) from 2007-10.



#### ESU Head Coach Denny Douds • 44th Year • Career Record: 263-195-3

Nine PSAC titles

Four NCAA Playoff appearances 2005 Northeast Regional title



Denny Douds, the all-time winningest coach in the history of the PSAC, is in his 44th season as head coach and 52nd year overall at ESU in 2017.

He finished the 2016 season with 441 games coached, an NCAA Division II record, and ranks 2nd among all active NCAA coaches with 260 career victories. He is 17th on the all-time college football win list.

Douds leads active college coaches with 451 games coached. He ranks 8th in games coached in NCAA football history and is one of 17 men to coach more than 400 games.

Douds has reached numerous milestones for coaching success and longevity, and has spent 54 seasons in the coaching profession - including 51 at ESU, 43 as head coach and 8 as an assistant.

He is one of 15 men to reach 40 seasons as head coach in college football history, the 9th to coach 40 years at one school and the 5th to spend all of his 40+ year career at the same institution.

Douds set the NCAA Division II record for most games coached in 2011, surpassing Jim Malosky of Minnesota-Duluth (393 games) on October 22 against Millersville.

He set the PSAC record for career wins in 2008 with a 44-41 (OT) victory over Shippensburg, his 213th career victory, surpassing Gene Carpenter of Millersville.

Douds, the only PSAC coach who is an active member of the teaching faculty at his school (following the retirement of Slippery Rock's George Mihalik last year), was the recipient of ESU's Great Teacher Award in 2013.

There have been 95 head football coaches at the other 15 PSAC institutions, and at least five at every school, since Douds took over as ESU's 8th head football coach in 1974. Since then, he has coached 24 AP Little All-Americans, 6 AFCA All-Americans and 6 finalists for the Harlon Hill Award, including quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger, who won the award in 2005.

In his 43 years as head coach, Douds has mentored 194 1st team All-PSAC selections and 923 letterwinners. An additional 151 players earned letters in his 8 years as an assistant coach from 1966-73. Including the numerous Warriors who were members of the team but didn't earn a letter, more than 1,000 players have contributed to the ESU football program during Douds' 51 years in the Poconos.

The Warriors have made 4 trips to the NCAA Playoffs under Douds, most recently in 2009. The 2000's featured a 77-34 record, 9 winning seasons, 3 NCAA Playoff trips and 2 PSAC East championships. ESU's 7 straight winning seasons from 2000-06 was the longest such streak of his career.

ESU made its 2nd and 3rd appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2004 and 2005, joining the 1991 squad which also advanced to the postseason. In 2005, the Warriors won three straight playoff games to claim the Northeast Region championship before bowing out in the national semifinals. ESU's 11-3 record set a school record for wins in a single season.

A native of Indiana, Pa., Douds was a high school coach in Erie, Pa. for two years and an assistant coach at West Virginia University for one year before accepting an assistant coach position at ESU.

He started as the Warriors' tight ends and linebackers coach under head coach Charlie Reese, and then became the team's defensive coordinator in 1968. After eight seasons assisting Reese, Douds took over as the school's eighth head football coach in 1974.

Under Douds' direction, the Warriors have captured nine PSAC Eastern Division titles with solo first-place finishes in 1975, 1976, 1978, 1982, 1983 and 1991 and ties for the top spot in 1980, 2002 and 2003. Before the PSAC championship game was eliminated in 1987, the Warriors won overall conference crowns in 1975, 1978 and 1982 and tied for the title with Shippensburg in 1976.
