### ESU vs. IUP • 1st & 10

**1 •** ESU travels to No. 6 IUP, its 2nd straight road trip to a 2016 NCAA DII Playoff qualifier to open the 2017 season. The Warriors knocked off Fairmont State, 20-16, last Thursday.

**2 •** ESU is 10-23 vs. teams ranked in the AFCA DII Top 25 (since 2000).  
• 1 ranked team in 2016 (#10 IUP - L 73-42)  
• 1-10 vs. Top 10 teams (2005 - W 52-39 at #2 Bloomsburg in NCAA Playoffs 2nd round)  
• This marks ESU's 2nd meeting vs. an AFCA-ranked IUP team. In 1996, in rankings conducted by the NCAA DII Football Committee, the Warriors knocked off #1 IUP, 23-12

**3 •** ESU head coach **Denny Douds**, in his 44th season, faces his hometown team for the 15th time. Douds is a 1959 graduate of Indiana High School, where his teams compiled a 3-year record of 26-1. The Warriors are 4-10 vs. IUP under Douds with wins in 1978, 1981, 1996 and 1997. IUP has won the last 5 meetings.

**4 •** Douds leads active NCAA coaches in games coached (452) and ranks 2nd in wins (261).  
• 7th in NCAA history in games coached  
• 1st in DII history in games coached  
• 4th in games coached at one school  
• t-16th in NCAA history in wins  
• 1st in PSAC history in wins (set in 2008)

**5 •** Douds is in his 44th season as head coach, ranking t-9th in NCAA history and ranking 5th in years coached at one school.

**6 •** ESU is playing the 2nd of 3 2017 opponents that qualified for the NCAA Playoffs in 2016.  
• W 20-16 at Fairmont State (Aug. 31)  
• at IUP (Sept. 9) [W 62-13 vs Fairmont State]  
• vs. California (Nov. 11) [regional runner-up]  
• ESU is 14-36 all-time vs. teams that qualified for the NCAA postseason the previous year

**7 •** ESU returned 12 starters (6 on both sides of the ball) for 2017, including 5 who have been named All-PSAC East in their careers.  
• ESU lost 3 All-PSAC East selections, including TB Robert Healy (4x All-PSAC East), ESU's all-time leader in rushing yards and yards from scrimmage.

**8 •** R-Jr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** (26 carries, 125 yds) led an offense that built a 32:10 to 27:50 margin in time of possession in last week's win at Fairmont State.  
• ESU ran 15 more plays than Fairmont (73-58) after opponents averaged 7.4 more plays per game (73.9 to 66.5) in 2016.

**9 •** Sr. LB **Dakota Everett**, one of 3 senior starters returning at linebacker, had 8 tackles, sack, FR and a blocked kick (3 senior LB combined for 24 tkl, 3.5 TFL, sack, FR).

**10 •** So. K **Jordan Walters** was named PSAC East Special Teams Athlete of the Week in his debut for the Warriors (2-for-2 FG, 2-for-2 PAT), hitting from 20 and 24 yards.

- 9th to coach 40 years at one school
- 5th to spend all of his 40+ year career at the same institution:
  - 55 years - Eddie Robinson, Grambling (1941-42, 45-97)
  - 50 years - John E. Dorman, Upper Iowa (1905-06, 09-42, 45-59)
  - 46 years - Joe Paterno, Penn State (1966-2011)
  - 44 years - Denny Douds, ESU (1974-present)
  - 40 years - Jim Malosky, Minn.-Duluth (1958-97)

### ENTERING THIS WEEK

- Douds has coached more games (452) than any active coach in NCAA football
- ranks 1st in DII history in games coached (set in 2011), and 8th in NCAA history (will tie Bob Ford [Albany] for 7th with 457th game on Oct. 5 vs. Millersville)
- 2nd in career wins (261) among active NCAA coaches
- 1st in the PSAC in career wins (set in 2008) and t-16th in NCAA history
- 62 career wins since turning 65 (more than 12 of the other 15 PSAC coaches have in their careers)

### DOUDS DWARFS PSAC EAST

- Douds had 260 career wins entering 2017
- the other 7 coaches in the PSAC East had combined for 232 wins while coaching in the PSAC - WCU's Bill Zwaan (116), Ship's Mark Maciejewski (46), Bloom's Paul Darragh (34), KU's Jim Clements (20), Millersville's Greg Breitbach (6), LHU's Dave Taynor (6) and Cheyney's Chris Roulhac (4)
- Douds has coached 43 seasons in the PSAC entering 2017 (other 7 - combined for 38).

## THE LAST MEETING

9-10-16 • #10 IUP 73, ESU 42

**EAST STROUDSBURG** – Lenny Williams threw for 380 yards and 3 TD, and ran for 88 yards and 3 more, to lead No. 10 IUP to a 73-42 win over ESU.

R-Sr. TB **Robert Healy** ran for 157 yards and a TD and had 7 catches for 117 yards for 274 yards from scrimmage, 2nd-most in school history, for ESU.

R-Sr. QB **Bruce Campbell** was 23-for-38 for 309 yards, 3 TD and 2 interceptions for his 2nd 300-yard passing game in 5 career starts.

Jr. WR **Tim Wilson** had 6 catches for 109 yards and 2 TD, all career-highs, and R-Jr. WR **Tommy House** had 3 catches for 52 yards and a TD. Sr. FB **Sean Roth** added 4 carries for 17 yards and a TD and So. TB **James Bell** had 2 carries for 13 yards and a TD.

Williams, a Harlon Hill candidate as a freshman in 2015, was 20-for-24 for 380 yards passing for IUP. Walt Pegues had 12 catches for 195 yards and a TD and JoJo Gause (3 catches, 80 yards, TD) and Allen Wright (2 catches, 86 yards, TD) also caught scoring passes.

Samir Bullock had 10 carries for 104 yards and a TD, starting TB Chris Temple had 9 carries for 53 yards and QB Mike Pietropola had 7 carries for 56 yards and a TD.

IUP gained 789 total yards, second-most in PSAC history - 395 rushing and 394 passing.

ESU scored on its opening drive, a 10-yard run by Bell, and Wilson caught a 52-yard TD from Campbell to make it 14-14 with 3:38 left in the first quarter.

## ESU Football Adopts State-of-the-Art Helmet Sensor Technology to Better Monitor Player Head Impacts

Aug. 30, 2017

ESU's football program is the first in the PSAC to adopt Riddell's InSite Impact Response System - the latest in head impact monitoring technology from the world's leading helmet manufacturer. ESU is one of 12 programs, among 170 in NCAA Division II, to utilize InSite during the 2017 season. The helmets for all 87 Warriors are equipped with InSite.

Riddell InSite is a football helmet-based sensor technology that alerts sideline staff when a player experiences a significant single impact or multiple impacts during a game or practice. The latest software - ISPM 3.0 - delivers more robust information about player head impacts including the location of the impact. It also offers new training opportunities based on data trends by player, and highlights East Stroudsburg's commitment to protecting its players not only through technique, but through technology.

"We are committed to using available technology to help keep our players as safe as possible on the field, both in practice and competition," said **Denny Douds**, ESU football head coach. "InSite allows our coaches and athletic trainers to have an extra set of eyes that helps them better monitor the action on the field. InSite also helps us identify players that are using less than optimal techniques and re-teach them. We feel this is an important investment in the health and safety of our football student-athletes here at ESU."

"The InSite helmet technology is another valuable resource that aids our athletic training staff in safeguarding our student-athletes," said **Colleen Shotwell, Ph.D., ATC**, ESU's coordinator of athletic training services. "The system provides objective measures of the impact and location of contact, which will allow us to more accurately monitor our student-athletes throughout their careers."

InSite was developed based on Riddell's Head Impact Telemetry System (HITS) and Sideline Response System (SRS), a technology that has analyzed more than 5 million impacts since 2003. This integrated technology fits into the liner of a Riddell helmet and is used to monitor players and alert the sideline to significant head impacts sustained during a football game or practice.

## WARRIORS HISTORY

### TWO TERWILLIGERS

- **Jimmy Terwilliger**, the 2005 Harlon Hill Trophy winner as a junior at ESU, is in his 3rd year on the Warriors' coaching staff as defensive backs coach
- He joins his father, **Mike Terwilliger**, ESU's offensive coordinator, on **Denny Douds'** staff
- Mike Terwilliger enters his 39th year as assistant coach after 4 years as ESU's starting QB from 1974-77 - Douds' first 4 years as head coach
- Mike was a 2-time 1st team All-PSAC East selection, leading ESU to a 30-4-1 record, the 1975 PSAC championship (10-0) and a tie in the 1976 State Game (9-0-1)
- Jimmy was 36-12 in 4 years as ESU's starting QB from 2003-06 and is the only 4-time 1st team All-PSAC East QB in conference history
- He set 18 DII and 2 NCAA all-division records, tying the all-time mark with 148 career TD passes and setting DII records for passing yards (14,350) and total offense (16,064), among other standards.

### ACADEMIC ACCOLADES

- ESU has produced 103 Academic All-District selections over the last 10 years, tied for 2nd-most in the PSAC
- ESU has ranked in the top 5 in the PSAC in Academic All-District selections in each of the last 10 years

**QB FAMILIES UNDER DOUDS**

The Soltes (Matt and Andy), Terwilligers (Mike and Jimmy) and Marshalls (Brian and Matt) have all thrown TD passes for the Warriors under Douds.

Soltes

Andy Soltes' only career TD was a 73-yard pass to Scott Benoit that put the Warriors ahead in the 4th quarter of a 17-9 win at West Chester in 1982. He suffered an injury in the spring game the following year.

Matt's 5th career TD was a 33-yard pass to Tim Wilson to beat West Chester, 35-28, on October 6, 2012. Matt was a 3-time Harlon Hill Trophy candidate, finished t-5th in the national voting in 2015 and threw 126 career TD passes (2nd in PSAC history, t-2nd in DII history).

Terwilligers

Mike Terwilliger, ESU's offensive coordinator, was QB for Douds' first four years (1974-77) and has been an assistant coach ever since. He led ESU to a 30-4-1 record in 35 starts and threw 33 TD passes.

His son, Jimmy, ESU's defensive backs coach, was a 4-year Harlon Hill candidate from 2003-06, the 2005 Harlon Hill Award winner, and tied the NCAA all-division record with 148 TD passes. Jimmy was 36-12, starting all 48 games, and led the Warriors to the NCAA DII semifinals in 2005.

Marshalls

Brian Marshall was the Warriors' QB in 1981, under Terwilliger's tutelage, and threw 5 TD passes.

His son, Matt, was a two-year starter, led ESU to the 2009 NCAA Playoffs and threw 61 TD passes (4th in school history) from 2007-10.

**ESU Head Coach Denny Douds • 44th Year • Career Record: 261-188-3****Nine PSAC titles****Four NCAA Playoff appearances****2005 Northeast Regional title**

Denny Douds, the all-time winningest coach in the history of the PSAC, is in his 44th season as head coach and 52nd year overall at ESU in 2017.

He finished the 2016 season with 441 games coached, an NCAA Division II record, and ranks 2nd among all active NCAA coaches with 260 career victories. He is 17th on the all-time college football win list.

Douds leads active college coaches with 451 games coached. He ranks 8th in games coached in NCAA football history and is one of 17 men to coach more than 400 games.

Douds has reached numerous milestones for coaching success and longevity, and has spent 54 seasons in the coaching profession - including 51 at ESU, 43 as head coach and 8 as an assistant.

He is one of 15 men to reach 40 seasons as head coach in college football history, the 9th to coach 40 years at one school and the 5th to spend all of his 40+ year career at the same institution.

Douds set the NCAA Division II record for most games coached in 2011, surpassing Jim Malosky of Minnesota-Duluth (393 games) on October 22 against Millersville.

He set the PSAC record for career wins in 2008 with a 44-41 (OT) victory over Shippensburg, his 213th career victory, surpassing Gene Carpenter of Millersville.

Douds, the only PSAC coach who is an active member of the teaching faculty at his school (following the retirement of Slippery Rock's George Mihalik last year), was the recipient of ESU's Great Teacher Award in 2013.

There have been 95 head football coaches at the other 15 PSAC institutions, and at least five at every school, since Douds took over as ESU's 8th head football coach in 1974. Since then, he has coached 24 AP Little All-Americans, 6 AFCA All-Americans and 6 finalists for the Harlon Hill Award, including quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger, who won the award in 2005.

In his 43 years as head coach, Douds has mentored 194 1st team All-PSAC selections and 923 letterwinners. An additional 151 players earned letters in his 8 years as an assistant coach from 1966-73. Including the numerous Warriors who were members of the team but didn't earn a letter, more than 1,000 players have contributed to the ESU football program during Douds' 51 years in the Poconos.

The Warriors have made 4 trips to the NCAA Playoffs under Douds, most recently in 2009. The 2000's featured a 77-34 record, 9 winning seasons, 3 NCAA Playoff trips and 2 PSAC East championships. ESU's 7 straight winning seasons from 2000-06 was the longest such streak of his career.

ESU made its 2nd and 3rd appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2004 and 2005, joining the 1991 squad which also advanced to the postseason. In 2005, the Warriors won three straight playoff games to claim the Northeast Region championship before bowing out in the national semifinals. ESU's 11-3 record set a school record for wins in a single season.

A native of Indiana, Pa., Douds was a high school coach in Erie, Pa. for two years and an assistant coach at West Virginia University for one year before accepting an assistant coach position at ESU.

He started as the Warriors' tight ends and linebackers coach under head coach Charlie Reese, and then became the team's defensive coordinator in 1968. After eight seasons assisting Reese, Douds took over as the school's eighth head football coach in 1974.

Under Douds' direction, the Warriors have captured nine PSAC Eastern Division titles with solo first-place finishes in 1975, 1976, 1978, 1982, 1983 and 1991 and ties for the top spot in 1980, 2002 and 2003. Before the PSAC championship game was eliminated in 1987, the Warriors won overall conference crowns in 1975, 1978 and 1982 and tied for the title with Shippensburg in 1976.

## GAME 1

**Aug. 31 • ESU 49, Brevard 14**

FAIRMONT, WV - R-Jr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** had 26 carries for 125 yards, Sr. WR **Tim Wilson** caught 4 passes for 84 yards and a TD and ESU's rebuilt defense held Fairmont State's offense to 9 points, all in the 1st half, for a 20-16 win.

ESU scored 17 straight points in a 14-minute span, covering most of the 2nd quarter and the early part of the 3rd, to lead 20-9 with just under 25 minutes left.

The only scoring in the remainder of the contest was an 8-yard interception return for a TD by Fairmont's Naiquan Thomas on ESU's 2nd play of the 4th quarter.

FSU, which was 10-2 overall and reached the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the first time in school history in 2016, drove inside the ESU 20 with less than 4 minutes left, but the Warriors held on 4th-and-6 from the 15 to turn the ball over on downs.

ESU managed to erase the final 3:49, gaining one first down by rush and another by a 15-yard facemask on 3rd-and-21, to seal the victory.

The defense forced 3 fumbles and held Fairmont to 197 yards on its final 9 possessions - the biggest chunk an 11-play, 86-yard drive that ended with a fumble at the ESU 12 on the first play of the 4th quarter - after FSU scored a FG and a TD on 2 of its first 3 possessions.

Anderson had ESU's 8th 100-yard rushing game in a season opener in its 44th year under Denny Douds, who leads active NCAA coaches in career games (452 - 8th all-time) and is 2nd among active coaches in career wins (261 - 16th all-time).

R-Sr. QB **Tim DiGiorgio**, who started the final 4 games last year, was 10-for-28 for 168 yards, 1 TD and 3 Int., connecting with Wilson for a 10-yard go-ahead TD with 8:16 left in the 2nd quarter.

DiGiorgio found Wilson for 43 yards to the 1 on ESU's next drive, with So. FB **Wyatt Clements** plunging in for his first TD and a 17-9 lead with 3:49 left in the 1st half.

So. K Jordan Walters was 2-for-2 on field goals, hitting from 20 and 24 yards, in his debut for ESU.

JaJuan Young-Battle was 21-for-32 for 234 yards and carried 11 times for 57 yards to lead FSU. Terrell Charles (887 yards, 12 TD in 2016) had 41 yards.

Andre Hall (5 catches, 79 yards) and Shawn Harris (5 catches, 77 yards) paced FSU's receivers.

R-So. S **Justin Johnson** had a forced fumble and recovery in the 3rd quarter, and So. CB **Jamal Cooley** forced a key fumble that Sr. LB **Dakota Everett** recovered on the first play of the 4th quarter.
