ESU vs. Fairmont State • 1st & 10

1 • ESU travels to Fairmont State for its 2017 season opener, and the first-ever meeting between the two schools.

• ESU's first match-up vs. a school from the Mountain East Conference (formerly WVIAC) since 2003 (W 35-7 at Shepherd).

2 • ESU is 31-12 in season openers under Douds, and 56-32-1 (.635) all-time in season openers entering its 90th season of varsity football.

• ESU has won 8 of its last 9 openers since 2008

3 • Last time out: ESU fell 57-15 at Slippery Rock in the 2016 season finale after trailing just 14-9 at halftime. SRU scored 30 points in an 8-minute span to start the 3rd quarter.

4 • ESU head coach **Denny Douds** leads active NCAA coaches in games coached (451) and ranks 2nd in wins (260).

• 7th in NCAA history in games coached

• 1st in DII history in games coached

• 4th in games coached at one school

• 17th in NCAA history in wins

• 1st in PSAC history in wins (set in 2008)

5 • Douds begins his 44th season as head coach, ranking t-9th in NCAA history and ranking 5th in years coached at one school.

6 • Fairmont State is one of 3 ESU opponents who qualified for the NCAA DII Playoffs in 2016, along with IUP (Sept. 9) and California (Nov. 11).

7 • ESU returns 12 starters (6 on both sides of the ball) for 2017, including 5 who have been named All-PSAC East in their careers.

• ESU lost 3 All-PSAC East selections, including TB Robert Healy (4x All-PSAC East), ESU's all-time leader in rushing yards and yards from scrimmage.

8 • Sr. WR **Tim Wilson** (58 rec, 910 yds, 8 TD) ranked 7th in the PSAC in receptions (5.8) and yards per game (91.0) in 2016, including 5 100-yard games.

• Wilson has more career receptions (80), yards (1,221) and TD (12) than all other Warriors combined.

9 • Jr. LT **Michael Fleming** (2x All-PSAC East), R-Sr. RG **Norman Rogers III** (2016 All-PSAC East) and R-Sr. C **Devon Ackerman** lead an offensive line that has 113 combined games of starting experience - Ackerman (33), Rogers (29), Fleming (19) and R-So. **Levi Murphy** (11).

10 • R-Sr. LB **Mike Wiand** (2016) and R-Sr. LB **Sekou Jones** (2015) have both earned All-PSAC East 2nd team honors for the ESU defense and lead an experienced LB group that features 3 senior starters, along with **Dakota Everett**.

• LB have combined for 50 career starts

 - 46 years - Joe Paterno, Penn State (1966-2011)
 - 44 years - Denny Douds, ESU (1974-present)
 - 40 years - Jim Malosky, Minn.-Duluth (1958-97)

ENTERING THIS WEEK

- Douds has coached more games (451) than any active coach in NCAA football
- ranks 1st in DII history in games coached (set in 2011), and 8th in NCAA history (will tie Bob Ford [Albany] for 7th with 457th game on Oct. 5 vs. Millersville)
- 2nd in career wins (260) among active NCAA coaches
- 1st in the PSAC in career wins (set in 2008) and 17th in NCAA history
- 61 career wins since turning 65 (more than 12 of the other 15 PSAC coaches have in their careers)

DOUDS DWARFS PSAC EAST

- Douds has 260 career wins entering 2017
- the other 7 coaches in the PSAC East had combined for 232 wins while coaching in the PSAC - WCU's Bill Zwaan (116), Ship's Mark Maciejewski (46), Bloom's Paul Darragh (34), KU's Jim Clements (20), Millersville's Greg Breitbach (6), LHU's Dave Taynor (6) and Cheyney's Chris Roulhac (4)
- Douds has coached 43 seasons in the PSAC entering 2017 (other 7 - combined for 38).

- **Jimmy Terwilliger**, the 2005 Harlon Hill Trophy winner as a junior at ESU, is in his 3rd year on the Warriors' coaching staff as defensive backs coach
- He joins his father, **Mike Terwilliger**, ESU's offensive coordinator, on **Denny Douds'** staff
- Mike Terwilliger enters his 39th year as assistant coach after 4 years as ESU's starting QB from 1974-77 - Douds' first 4 years as head coach
- Mike was a 2-time 1st team All-PSAC East selection, leading ESU to a 30-4-1 record, the 1975 PSAC championship (10-0) and a tie in the 1976 State Game (9-0-1)

- He set 18 DII and 2 NCAA all-division records, tying the all-time mark with 148 career TD passes and setting DII records for passing yards (14,350) and total offense (16,064), among other standards.

WARRIORS FROM 2000-09

- The Warriors had their winningest decade in school history in the 2000's, going 77-34 for a .694 winning percentage
- They had 9 winning seasons in 10 years, made 3 NCAA Playoff appearances (2004, 2005, 2009), won PSAC East titles in 2002 and 2003, and had a school-record 11 wins in 2005
- ESU has an all-time record of 476-324-19 (.593)

The Soltes (Matt and Andy), Terwilligers (Mike and Jimmy) and Marshalls (Brian and Matt) have all thrown TD passes for the Warriors under Douds.

Soltes

Andy Soltes' only career TD was a 73-yard pass to Scott Benoit that put the Warriors ahead in the 4th quarter of a 17-9 win at West Chester in 1982. He suffered an injury in the spring game the following year.

Matt's 5th career TD was a 33-yard pass to Tim Wilson to beat West Chester, 35-28, on October 6, 2012. Matt was a 3-time Harlon Hill Trophy candidate, finished t-5th in the national voting in 2015 and threw 126 career TD passes (2nd in PSAC history, t-2nd in DII history).

Terwilligers

Mike Terwilliger, ESU's offensive coordinator, was QB for Douds' first four years (1974-77) and has been an assistant coach ever since. He led ESU to a 30-4-1 record in 35 starts and threw 33 TD passes.

His son, Jimmy, ESU's defensive backs coach, was a 4-year Harlon Hill candidate from 2003-06, the 2005 Harlon Hill Award winner, and tied the NCAA all-division record with 148 TD passes. Jimmy was 36-12, starting all 48 games, and led the Warriors to the NCAA DII semifinals in 2005.

Marshalls

Brian Marshall was the Warriors' QB in 1981, under Terwilliger's tutelage, and threw 5 TD passes.

His son, Matt, was a two-year starter, led ESU to the 2009 NCAA Playoffs and threw 61 TD passes (4th in school history) from 2007-10.

ESU Head Coach Denny Douds • 44th Year • Career Record: 260-188-3**Nine PSAC titles****Four NCAA Playoff appearances****2005 Northeast Regional title**

Denny Douds, the all-time winningest coach in the history of the PSAC, is in his 44th season as head coach and 52nd year overall at ESU in 2017.

He finished the 2016 season with 441 games coached, an NCAA Division II record, and ranks 2nd among all active NCAA coaches with 260 career victories. He is 17th on the all-time college football win list.

Douds leads active college coaches with 451 games coached. He ranks 8th in games coached in NCAA football history and is one of 17 men to coach more than 400 games.

Douds has reached numerous milestones for coaching success and longevity, and has spent 54 seasons in the coaching profession - including 51 at ESU, 43 as head coach and 8 as an assistant.

He is one of 15 men to reach 40 seasons as head coach in college football history, the 9th to coach 40 years at one school and the 5th to spend all of his 40+ year career at the same institution.

Douds set the NCAA Division II record for most games coached in 2011, surpassing Jim Malosky of Minnesota-Duluth (393 games) on October 22 against Millersville.

He set the PSAC record for career wins in 2008 with a 44-41 (OT) victory over Shippensburg, his 213th career victory, surpassing Gene Carpenter of Millersville.

Douds, the only PSAC coach who is an active member of the teaching faculty at his school (following the retirement of Slippery Rock's George Mihalik last year), was the recipient of ESU's Great Teacher Award in 2013.

There have been 95 head football coaches at the other 15 PSAC institutions, and at least five at every school, since Douds took over as ESU's 8th head football coach in 1974. Since then, he has coached 24 AP Little All-Americans, 6 AFCA All-Americans and 6 finalists for the Harlon Hill Award, including quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger, who won the award in 2005.

In his 43 years as head coach, Douds has mentored 194 1st team All-PSAC selections and 923 letterwinners. An additional 151 players earned letters in his 8 years as an assistant coach from 1966-73. Including the numerous Warriors who were members of the team but didn't earn a letter, more than 1,000 players have contributed to the ESU football program during Douds' 51 years in the Poconos.

The Warriors have made 4 trips to the NCAA Playoffs under Douds, most recently in 2009. The 2000's featured a 77-34 record, 9 winning seasons, 3 NCAA Playoff trips and 2 PSAC East championships. ESU's 7 straight winning seasons from 2000-06 was the longest such streak of his career.

ESU made its 2nd and 3rd appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2004 and 2005, joining the 1991 squad which also advanced to the postseason. In 2005, the Warriors won three straight playoff games to claim the Northeast Region championship before bowing out in the national semifinals. ESU's 11-3 record set a school record for wins in a single season.

A native of Indiana, Pa., Douds was a high school coach in Erie, Pa. for two years and an assistant coach at West Virginia University for one year before accepting an assistant coach position at ESU.

He started as the Warriors' tight ends and linebackers coach under head coach Charlie Reese, and then became the team's defensive coordinator in 1968. After eight seasons assisting Reese, Douds took over as the school's eighth head football coach in 1974.

Under Douds' direction, the Warriors have captured nine PSAC Eastern Division titles with solo first-place finishes in 1975, 1976, 1978, 1982, 1983 and 1991 and ties for the top spot in 1980, 2002 and 2003. Before the PSAC championship game was eliminated in 1987, the Warriors won overall conference crowns in 1975, 1978 and 1982 and tied for the title with Shippensburg in 1976.

GAME 1

Sept. 1 • ESU 49, Brevard 14

BREVARD, N.C. – R-Sr. TB **Robert Healy** ran for 139 yards and 3 TD, and R-Sr. QB **Bruce Campbell** threw for 201 yards and 2 TD in his 4th career start as ESU won its season opener, 49-14, at Brevard on Thursday night.

Healy had his 2nd career game with 3 TD, and first with 3 rushing TD, as the Warriors led 14-7 at halftime before outscoring Brevard 21-0 in the 3rd quarter, including two TD by Healy.

Campbell threw TD passes of 10 yards to Sr. FB **Sean Roth** in the 2nd quarter and 31 yards to Jr. WR **Tim Wilson** on the first drive in the 3rd quarter.

Jr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** had 8 carries for 79 yards and a TD and So. TB **James Bell** had 6 carries for 19 yards and a TD, both scoring in the 4th quarter.

Wilson had 5 catches for 58 yards and a TD and accumulated 109 all-purpose yards, including a 23-yard kick return, 19-yard punt return and 9-yard run.

R-Sr. TE **Anthony Castillo** had 2 catches for 61 yards, including a 44-yarder to set Campbell's 10-yard TD to Roth, and Roth had 2 catches for 36 yards.

Healy added 2 catches for 17 yards for 156 yards from scrimmage. ESU's career leader in rushing yards (2,830) and yards from scrimmage (4,352) entering his senior season, Healy moved within 31 yards of becoming the first ESU player with 3,000 rushing yards.

Healy had his 11th career 100-yard rushing game, 2nd-most in school history behind Andre Castiglioni's 14 (1999-01). He had his 28th game with 100 yards from scrimmage in his 34th career game.

The Warriors gained 475 yards on 73 plays, with 271 yards on 46 carries and 204 passing yards.

ESU's 271 rushing yards are its most in 43 season openers under head coach **Denny Douds**, and Healy's 139 rushing yards are 3rd-most in a season opener.

Campbell was 14-for-26 for 201 yards and 2 TD, going 8-for-10 for 102 yards and a TD in the 2nd half. R-Fr. QB **Gabe French** was 1-for-1 for 3 yards, completing his first career attempt.

Brevard finished with 177 yards on 52 plays - 162 yards on 47 rushes, and 15 yards passing (2-for-5).

The Tornados had a pair of long TD drives - 15 plays for 78 yards spanning the 1st and 2nd quarters, and 16 plays for 77 yards spanning the 3rd and 4th quarters - but just 22 yards on its other 21 plays.

EAST STROUDSBURG – Lenny Williams threw for 380 yards and 3 TD, and ran for 88 yards and 3 more, to lead No. 10 IUP to a 73-42 win over ESU.

R-Sr. TB **Robert Healy** ran for 157 yards and a TD and had 7 catches for 117 yards for 274 yards from scrimmage, 2nd-most in school history, for ESU.

R-Sr. QB **Bruce Campbell** was 23-for-38 for 309 yards, 3 TD and 2 interceptions for his 2nd 300-yard passing game in 5 career starts.

Jr. WR **Tim Wilson** had 6 catches for 109 yards and 2 TD, all career-highs, and R-Jr. WR **Tommy House** had 3 catches for 52 yards and a TD. Sr. FB **Sean Roth** added 4 carries for 17 yards and a TD and So. TB **James Bell** had 2 carries for 13 yards and a TD.

Williams, a Harlon Hill candidate as a freshman in 2015, was 20-for-24 for 380 yards passing for IUP. Walt Pegues had 12 catches for 195 yards and a TD and JoJo Gause (3 catches, 80 yards, TD) and Allen Wright (2 catches, 86 yards, TD) also caught scoring passes.

Samir Bullock had 10 carries for 104 yards and a TD, starting TB Chris Temple had 9 carries for 53 yards and QB Mike Pietropola had 7 carries for 56 yards and a TD.

IUP gained 789 total yards, second-most in PSAC history - 395 rushing and 394 passing.

ESU scored on its opening drive, a 10-yard run by Bell, and Wilson caught a 52-yard TD from Campbell to make it 14-14 with 3:38 left in the first quarter.

IUP scored the next 31 points, including an 8-yard interception return for a TD by defensive tackle Jemal Averette, before ESU cut it to 45-21 at halftime on a 19-yard TD pass from Campbell to House.

Healy's 274 yards from scrimmage are 2nd-most in school history behind Joe Partridge's 284 yards (all rushing) at Cheyney in 2007.

ERIE - R-Sr. TB **Robert Healy** ran for 256 yards and 4 TD and gained 292 yards from scrimmage, a school record, leading ESU to a 34-31 win at Mercyhurst

Healy tied a school record with 4 rushing TD and had a career-high 30 carries while adding 2 receptions for 36 yards for the Warriors (2-1), who overcame a 14-3 2nd-quarter deficit to beat the Lakers (1-2).

R-Sr. QB **Bruce Campbell** was 14-for-27 for 159 yards passing and Jr. WR **Tim Wilson** had 8 catches for 65 yards, including a key 37-yarder, as ESU gained 435 yards on 62 plays (276 yards rushing).

ESU trailed 14-3 early in the 2nd quarter as So. K **Nicolas Ruiz** hit a 21-yard field goal before Mercyhurst scored twice, on a 53-yard pass from Doug Altavilla (21-37, 317 yards, 3 TD) to Danavian Clay and a 2-yard run by Drew Robinson (6 carries, 26 yards) to cap a 48-yard drive after the 2nd of 2 interceptions.

The Warriors rallied to lead 17-14 at halftime as Healy scored on a 5-yard run (following a 36-yard catch on the drive) with 6:45 left in the 2nd quarter, and a 13-yard run by Healy (following a 35-yard run on the drive) with 2:12 left in the half.

ESU led throughout the 2nd half, with Healy giving ESU a 24-14 margin with 7:00 left in the 3rd quarter after a 37-yard completion from Campbell to Wilson.

Both teams traded field goals - Dylan Kondis made a 31-yarder for Mercyhurst and Ruiz hit a 28-yarder for ESU with 12:16 remaining - as the Warriors led 27-17 early in the 4th quarter.

Mercyhurst cut it to 27-24 on a 57-yard TD pass from Altavilla to Brad Novak with 8:51 left, before Healy had a 77-yard TD run on 2nd-and-24 to give the Warriors a 34-24 cushion with 5:55 remaining.

Mercyhurst went 81 yards in 12 plays to get within 34-31 with 1:55 left on a 21-yard TD pass from Altavilla to Brian Matthews.

The Warriors recovered the onside kick - by Sr. FB **Sean Roth** - and ran all but 8 seconds off the clock. So. P **Sam O'Brien** got the punt away as the Warriors held on.

R-Jr. LB **Sekou Jones** led the Warriors with 11 tackles and Fr. CB **Andre' Gray** had 4 passes defended (interception, 3 pass breakups) in his first career action.

MILLERSVILLE – R-Sr. TB **Robert Healy** gained 208 yards from scrimmage and scored 4 TD, and R-Sr. QB **Bruce Campbell** added 330 yards of total offense, a pass TD and a rush TD, to lead ESU to a 38-23 win at Millersville.

Healy ran for 163 yards and 3 TD, setting a school record with his 15th career 100-yard rushing game, and added 5 catches for 45 yards and a TD, and Campbell was 10-for-19 for 242 yards and a TD passing and had 8 carries for 88 yards and a score.

ESU head coach **Denny Douds** moved into a tie for 8th on the NCAA all-division list for games coached (446), and a tie for 4th in games coached at one school.

Campbell hit four long pass plays - two to Jr. WR **Tim Wilson** (2 catches, 105 yards) - while Fr. WR **Javier Buffalo** had a catch for 48 yards and R-Sr. TE **Anthony Castillo** had a catch for 34 yards for the Warriors.

ESU converted 11-of-16 3rd down opportunities while holding Millersville to 4-for-15. R-So. P **Sam O'Brien** twice pinned Millersville inside its own 5-yard line, and So. **Nicolas Ruiz** made a 20-yard field goal.

ESU's defense sacked Millersville R-Fr. QB Tony Staffieri 7 times and intercepted him twice inside the 25-yard line. Staffieri, in his 1st career start, had 408 yards of total offense, going 13-for-36 for 246 yards and 3 TD, and rushing 26 times for 162 yards. Kevin Wiggins had 5 catches for 144 yards and all 3 TD.

ESU led 24-13 at halftime, building a 24-6 lead before the Marauders scored with 7 seconds left in the 1st half. MU cut the ESU lead to 31-23 midway through the 3rd quarter - getting a 29-yard field goal by Evan Stahl and a 37-yard TD pass to Wiggins around a 10-yard TD run by Healy - but the Warriors kept the Marauders off the board from the 8:09 mark of the 3rd through the end of the contest.

Sr. FS **Jimmy Verzicco** had an interception after Millersville drove inside the 5-yard line midway through the 3rd quarter, and the Warriors forced a pair of 3-and-outs, produced a fumble recovery to end a promising Marauders drive and held MU out of the end zone in the final half-minute to ice the game.

EAST STROUDSBURG – R-Sr. TB **Robert Healy** set a school record for career all-purpose yards in ESU's 49-30 loss vs. Kutztown. Healy, already ESU's all-time leader in rushing yards and yards from scrimmage, gained 160 yards (124 rushing, 2 TD; 36 receiving) to surpass former All-America WR Evan Prall (5,682 yards - 2003-06).

Healy finished with 5,731 career all-purpose yards - 3,853 rushing and 1,878 receiving. He also set ESU's season record for rushing TD (16), and eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the season (1,023).

KU (4-3, 4-0) gained 668 yards - 459 rushing and 209 passing - led by 261 rushing yards and 3 TD by R-So. TB Craig Reynolds. R-Fr. QB Collin DiGalbo threw for 209 yards and a TD and ran for 70 yards and a score, and James Wah, Jr. had 7 carries for 68 yards and 2 TD.

ESU R-Jr. QB **Tim DiGiorgio** was 9-for-18 for 145 yards and 2 TD in relief of R-Sr. QB **Bruce Campbell** (7-for-14, 92 yards, 2 interceptions; 23 rushing yards).

R-Jr. WR **Tommy House** (4 catches, 74 yards, TD) and Fr. WR **Javier Buffalo** (2 catches, 70 yards, TD) both caught TD passes from DiGiorgio - House a 38-yarder with 53 seconds left in the 2nd quarter, and Buffalo a 50-yard catch-and-run midway through the 4th.

ESU struck with a 9 play, 80-yard drive capped by the first of Healy's 2 TD runs, but KU scored on 3 straight possessions for a 21-7 lead with 13:14 left in the 2nd.

The Warriors defense held Kutztown to 95 yards over its final 4 possessions of the 1st half, and ESU scored the last 9 points of the 2nd quarter to pull within 21-16 - a 39-yard field goal by So. K **Nicolas Ruiz**, and the 38-yard TD pass from DiGiorgio to House.

Both teams traded punts to start the 2nd half, before Kutztown scored 3 straight TD. Buffalo answered with a 50-yard TD pass from DiGiorgio, Wah scored on a 42-yard run for Kutztown and Healy finished the scoring with a 36-yard TD after a Kutztown fumble.

Reynolds, 3rd in the PSAC in rushing (107.3 ypg) gained 345 all-purpose yards for KU (261 rush, 11 rec, 73 KR). Healy entered ranked 1st in DII in yards from scrimmage (203.2 ypg) and 3rd in rushing (149.8 ypg).

Jake Perry had 2 interceptions to pace KU's defense.

BLOOMSBURG – Lawrence Elliott, Jr. ran for 124 yards and 3 TD to lead Bloomsburg to a 35-14 win.

After a scoreless opening half, Bloomsburg scored 21 3rd-quarter points - then saw ESU close the margin to 21-14 - before a lengthy scoring drive and an interception for a TD finally put away the Warriors.

R-Sr. TB **Robert Healy** ran for 80 yards and a TD and had 29 receiving yards to lead ESU. R-Jr. QB **Tim DiGiorgio** was 22-for-39 for 247 yards, a TD and 2 interceptions in his 1st career start, throwing a 37-yard TD to Fr. WR **Nolan Ridgway**. Jr. WR **Tim Wilson** had 8 catches for 92 yards, R-So. TB **Marquis Fells** had 4 catches for 45 yards and Healy had 4 catches for 29.

Bloomsburg ran for 283 yards on 49 carries led by Elliott (17 carries, 124 yards, 3 TD), Joe Parsnik (16 carries, 89 yards) and QB Duffy Gilhool (14 carries, 65 yards, TD), who was 13-for-20 for 144 yards in his 1st career start.

Elliott was also Gilhool's top target with 4 catches for 43 yards, accounting for 167 yards from scrimmage.

Healy, the DII leader in yards from scrimmage (197.0 ypg) entering the weekend, gained 109 yards to eclipse the 100-yard mark for the 35th time in 41 career games. Healy had his 12th straight game with 100 yards from scrimmage to match his own school record.

The 0-0 tie at halftime was ESU's first since 2000, when the Warriors emerged with a 12-6 win at West Chester in the second game of the season. Both teams had 118 yards of total offense in the 1st half, combining for 3 missed field goals, 6 punts and an interception.

The Huskies gained 199 yards in the 3rd quarter, scoring on all 3 of their offensive possessions, to open a 21-0 lead - a 4-yard run by Gilhool (after a 4th-down conversion), a 48-yard run by Elliott, and an 11-yard run by Elliott set up by a 43-yard run by Parsnik.

ESU cut the margin to 21-7 on the 3rd play of the 4th quarter, starting with a 25-yard pass to Wilson and finishing with Healy's 5-yard TD run, his 17th of the year.

DiGiorgio led ESU 72 yards in 7 plays to make it 21-14 with 10:05 left, capped by the 37-yard TD pass to Ridgway on 3rd-and-10.

The Huskies' next possession, a 15 play, 75-yard drive that erased 8:03, included 2 3rd-down conversions and a 4th-and-4 from the 28, setting up a 13-yard TD run by Elliott for a 28-14 lead with 2:02 left. Dexter Jordan (2 interceptions) sealed the win with a 42-yard interception return for a TD on an ESU 4th-down attempt.

Healy ran for 57 yards on 8 carries in the 1st half to equal the single-season rushing mark of 1,160 yards set by Andre Castiglioni in 2000.

ESU's all-time leader in rushing yards (3,990) and yards from scrimmage (5,905), Healy left due to injury on the final play of the 2nd quarter and did not return.

ESU trailed 13-7 at halftime, but saw West Chester score on its first possession of the 3rd quarter and add 21 4th-quarter points to pull away.

Jarel Elder (17 carries, 118 yards, 2 TD) and Eerin Young (13 carries, 110 yards, TD) led a WCU offense that gained 482 yards, including 386 on the ground.

R-Jr. QB **Tim DiGiorgio**, making his second start, was 21-for-37 for 292 yards, a TD and an interception. Jr. WR **Tim Wilson** had 6 catches for a career-high 111 yards, Fr. WR **Elijah Rehm** had 5 catches for 53 yards (both career-highs) and Fr. WR **Javier Buffalo** had 2 catches for a career-high 88 yards, including a 46-yard TD from DiGiorgio in the 4th quarter.

Healy added 2 catches for 8 yards for 65 yards from scrimmage, ending a streak of 12 straight games with 100+ yards from scrimmage, and extending a streak with his 32nd straight game with a reception.

He extended his ESU single-season rushing TD record to 18 on the first drive of the game, tying Toby Barkman (1960-63) for 2nd on the career list (32).

Healy capped a 6 play, 75-yard drive with DiGiorgio going 4-for-5 for 62 yards, including a 42-yarder to Buffalo, before scoring from 13 yards just 1:56 in.

WCU answered with a 72-yard drive, finishing with a 12-yard TD run by Elder. After 8 straight punts, WCU took a 13-7 lead on an 8-yard TD pass from Pat Moriarty to Tyler Karpinski with 10 seconds left in the half.

WCU received the 2nd-half kickoff and drove 69 yards in 9 plays, setting up a 6-yard TD run by Mike Class to lead 20-7. Elder scored on a 2-yard run to make it 27-7 with 11:43 left in the 4th quarter, before DiGiorgio hit Buffalo for a 46-yard TD to get the Warriors within 27-14.

WCU stretched its lead with a 5-yard run by Young, completing a 65-yard drive, and got a 28-yard interception return for a TD by Nydair Rouse for 14 points in a 12 seconds to go ahead 41-14 with 6:42 left.

EAST STROUDSBURG – Caleb Walton threw for 300 yards and 5 TD, including 4 to Shawn Seif, and John Ford ran for 206 yards and 2 TD to lead LHU past ESU, 66-41.

Seif had 9 catches for 210 yards, all in the 1st half, to help LHU to its 4th win in the last 5 games.

R-Jr. QB **Tim DiGiorgio** was 36-for-60 for 347 yards and 3 TD, with R-Sr. QB **Bruce Campbell** going 9-for-11 for 121 yards and 2 TD in the 4th quarter, to lead ESU.

Jr. WR **Tim Wilson** had 13 catches for 146 yards and 3 TD, all career-highs. Fr. WR **Javier Buffalo** had 10 catches for 94 yards and a TD, and R-Jr. WR **Tommy House** had 6 catches for 88 yards and a TD.

ESU R-Sr. TB **Robert Healy**, who ranked 2nd in NCAA DII in yards from scrimmage (172.6 ypg), 9th in rushing (128.9 ypg), tied for 2nd in rush TD (18) and tied for 4th in total TD (19) entering the week, played one snap after an injury on the final play of the 1st half vs. WCU.

Healy had a 3-yard QB sneak in the 3rd quarter – setting ESU's single-season rushing record (1,163 yards) which he shared with Andre Castiglioni (1,160 yards - 2000) entering the game. He also set ESU's single-season rushing TD record (18) in 8.5 games.

Healy extended his ESU records for rushing (3,993) and yards from scrimmage and all-purpose yards (5,908).

Buffalo's 10 catches tied an ESU freshman record, matching Sam Shuman at Bloomsburg in 2006. Wilson's 13 catches rank tied for 7th in school history.

DiGiorgio's effort ranks 2nd at ESU in pass attempts (60) and t-4th in completions (36). ESU's 45 completions and 71 pass attempts are both records, surpassing the marks of 40 completions and 70 attempts (both by Matt Soltes) set in last year's 69-67 (50T) loss vs. Ship.

DiGiorgio (3) and Campbell (2) gave ESU 2 players with multiple TD passes for the 4th time in school history, and are the first duo to throw for 300 yards and 100 yards in the same game.

SLIPPERY ROCK - Don King III threw for 527 yards and 7 touchdowns, and Marcus Johnson had 10 catches for 237 yards and 4 scores, as Slippery Rock posted a 57-15 win over ESU in the 2016 season finale for both schools at Mihalik-Thompson Stadium.

ESU (4-7) hung with the Rock for 30 minutes, leading 9-7 late in the 2nd quarter and trailing 14-9 at halftime, before SRU (7-4) scored 30 points in an 8-minute span to start the 3rd quarter.

Jr. WR **Tim Wilson** had a 70-yard TD catch from R-Sr. QB **Bruce Campbell** for the Warriors score, and So. K **Nicolas Ruiz** made field goals of 38, 35 and 31 yards in the 1st half.

R-Jr. QB **Tim DiGiorgio** started and was 9-for-19 for 87 yards in the 1st half. Campbell was 8-for-17 for 110 yards and the TD to Wilson (3 catches, 79 yards). Fr. WR **Elijah Rehm** had 5 catches for 46 yards and R-Jr. WR **Tommy House** had four catches for 38 yards.

R-So. TB **Marquis Fells** had 21 carries for 57 yards and 2 catches for 9 yards with R-Sr. TB **Robert Healy** (ESU's all-time rushing leader) and So. TB **James Bell** out of the lineup due to injury.

King was 28-for-38 passing for Slippery Rock. Drew Scales had 6 catches for 87 yards and 2 TD and Taishan Tucker added 4 catches for 92 yards to supplement Johnson's 237 yards and 4 scores.

Fr. CB **Jamal Cooley** intercepted King to set up a go-ahead field goal by Ruiz late in the 2nd quarter, before the Rock went 71 yards to take a 14-9 lead on a 13-yard pass from King to Johnson with 1:08 left until halftime.

King hit Johnson for a 51-yard TD to start the 2nd half, followed by Campbell's 70-yard TD to Wilson, but SRU answered with 2 more TD passes from King to Johnson (25 and 70 yards), a safety and a 38-yard TD from King to Andrew Bridgeforth made it 44-15 at the 7:33 mark of the 3rd quarter.

Slippery Rock finished its scoring in the 4th quarter with a 5-yard TD pass from King to Scales to complete a 10 play, 99-yard drive and a 63-yard interception return for a TD by Anthony Zappone.

SRU had a 568-225 advantage in total offense, with both teams finishing with less than 50 yards rushing. ESU ran for 28 yards on 30 carries, and the Rock had 41 yards on 36 carries.

R-Rs. S **Maurice Jackson** had 12 tackles, 4 tackles for loss, 2 sacks and a forced fumble and Jr. S **Chase May** had 10 tackles to lead the ESU defense. R-So. LB **Marquis Brownlee** made 8 tackles and R-Jr. LB **Mike Wiand** (2 TFL, sack) and Jr. LB **Dakota Everett** had 7 stops each.

Zappone had 12 tackles, 2 TFL, a sack and the interception return for a TD to lead Slippery Rock. Joe Phillips had 3 of the Rock's 6 sacks.

ESU got off to a 4-2 start to the 2016 season on the strength of Healy, who ranked 2nd in DII in yards from scrimmage (172.6 ypg) through the first 9 weeks of the season prior to his injury on the final play of the 1st half vs. West Chester on October 29.

Healy set ESU's single-season rushing record (1,163 yards) with a 3-yard carry on his only snap last week. He did not play at Slippery Rock and concluded his career with ESU records for rushing yards (3,993), yards from scrimmage and all-purpose yards (5,908) while compiling 32 rushing TD and 44 total TD, including 18 rushing TD (19 total TD) as a senior.

Wilson had 58 catches for 910 yards and 8 TD in 10 games in his first action since the 2013 season, posting 5 100-yard games including 13 catches for 146 yards and 3 TD last week vs. Lock Haven.

Campbell started the first 7 games and was 99-for-190 for 1,511 yards, 12 TD and 8 interceptions in 9 games.

DiGiorgio made the final 4 starts and was 104-for-186 for 1,226 yards, 8 TD and 5 interceptions in 7 games.

Wiand, a 2nd-year starter after transferring from Penn State, finishes the year as ESU's top tackler with 82, including 7 for a loss, 2.5 sacks and 2 interceptions.

R-Fr. S **Justin Johnson** had 76 tackles (5 TFL, 3 sacks) in 10 games, and Sr. FS **Jimmy Verzicco** had 69 tackles and an interception in 11 games. Everett and Jackson made 58 tackles each.

Ruiz's 3-for-3 effort gives him a final line of 8-for-14 on field goals and 43-for-46 on extra points for 67 points.
