East Stroudsburg University is nestled in the Pocono Mountains, which offer year-round outdoor recreation of all sorts for sports enthusiasts. From hiking in the fall to biking in the spring to swimming, golfing and fishing in the summer to snowboarding, skiing or tubing in the winter, there is plenty to do at any time of the year. Throw in shopping, great restaurants and plenty of attractions and there is something for everyone, no matter the season.

ESU is located approximately 75 miles west of New York City, 85 miles northeast of Philadelphia, 40 miles northeast of the Allentown/Bethlehem/Easton area and 40 miles southeast of Wilkes-Barre/Scranton.

The campus is 1/4 mile from exit 308, Interstate 80. Exit right onto Prospect Street.

To Reach Eiler-Martin Stadium — One block after the first light turn right on Centre Street. Stay on the road past one stop sign and the stadium will be in front of you.

Football Office, Second Floor, Koehler Fieldhouse — Take right at the first light on East Brown Street. Go up the hill 6/10th of a mile, take the first left onto Smith Street. The fieldhouse is on the left on the corner of Smith and Normal streets.

Providing High-Quality, Higher Education *ESU - In its 118th Year of Service*

Founded in 1893 as a Normal School, East Stroudsburg University has been offering quality higher education to the citizens of Pennsylvania for more than a century.

With an enrollment of more than 7,500 students and a strong commitment to academic excellence, ESU's programs continually earn the highest levels of accreditation in their fields.

The university's most recently constructed and largest academic building is the \$40 million Warren E. and Sandra Hoeffner Science and Technology Center, a state-of-the-art facility and the first new major academic building at ESU since 1979. The late Warren Hoeffner '55, quarterback of the Warriors' 1954 championship team, and his wife Sandra was the lead donors for the project.

The Center is in its third year of service and features a planetarium, rooftop observatory and a wildlife museum of natural history. The facility supports research activities and provides classroom, laboratory, conference and office space for diverse departments from the sciences and mathematics to computer science.

Other recent contributions to the ongoing transformation of the campus include an investment of over \$10 million dollars in safety and other improvement projects associated with storm water management and campus beautification.

The campus consists of 66 buildings on 252 acres and boasts a student-to-teacher ratio of 18 to 1.

More than 2,100 students reside in eight residence halls. The university also offers apartment-style housing for another 200 students on the main campus, along with University Ridge, a 10 building apartment-style housing complex adjacent to campus that accommodates 541 students.

Approximately 74 percent of the students receive some form of financial aid, including scholarships, loans and grants.

The 2010-11 academic year will mark the university's 118th year of operation and the school has approximately 35,000 alumni.

ESU, like many other public colleges and universities across the country, started as a normal school, a professional school for the training of teachers.

ESU History

East Stroudsburg Normal School was founded to serve students in the state's normal school fourth district and had 320 students enrolled when classes started on September 4, 1893.

In 1926 after the state assumed control of the school, the original name was changed to **East Stroudsburg State Teachers' College**.

The school became **East Stroudsburg State College** in 1960 to reflect the school's expanded curriculum with liberal arts programs and graduate degrees.

In July 1983, the Pennsylvania General Assembly established the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education consisting of 14 universities and **East Stroudsburg University** was born as a comprehensive regional institution.

2010 Football Schedule

Saturday, Sept. 4 at Pace 1:00

The Warriors kick off their 83rd season with the first-ever meeting against Pace of the Northeast-10 Conference. Head coach Denny Douds will coach the 376th game of his career, while Pace's Chris Dapolito (Duke '05) makes his collegiate head coaching debut.

Saturday, Sept. 11 IUP 6:00

The Crimson Hawks trek to Eiler-Martin Stadium for the second time in four years. They left with a 38-23 win in 2007 and hold an 8-6 edge in the all-time series. Douds owns a 5-4 mark against Lou Tepper and was 5-2 vs. Tepper's Edinboro teams from 2000-05.

Saturday, Sept. 18 at California TBA

A pair of 200-win coaches meet at California's Adamson Stadium when Douds (226) and John Luckhardt (205) lock horns for the third time. ESU won 41-34 in 2006 and Cal posted a 26-3 win in the 2007 season opener, the first of their three straight regional titles.

Saturday, Sept. 25 *WEST CHESTER 1:00

ESU snapped a six-game losing streak vs. WCU with a 21-20 win at Farrell Stadium a year ago when Matt Marshall threw the go-ahead TD pass to Jordan Hallman in the fourth quarter. Both teams will look for a key win to open the PSAC East schedule this fall.

Saturday, Oct. 2 *at Bloomsburg 1:00

The Warriors have been on the wrong side of the last four meetings since a 52-39 win at Bloomsburg in the NCAA Playoffs in 2005. ESU still holds a 38-33-2 lead in the series which began in 1927 and will continue uninterrupted for the 52nd straight year in 2010.

Saturday, Oct. 9 *KUTZTOWN 2:00

Marshall threw for 430 yards, including the go-ahead TD to Ed Kiser on the first possession of OT, and ESU stopped KU quarterback Kevin Morton at the one-yard line on fourth down to seal a 27-20 road win last year, the Warriors' ninth straight in the series.

Saturday, Oct. 16 *at C.W. Post 1:00

ESU had won all four meetings since 2004 until the Pioneers posted a 42-24 win a year ago at Eiler-Martin. The Warriors' last trip to Long Island resulted in a 48-42 victory in 2008, highlighted by strong winds and a 35-point ESU outburst in the second quarter.

Saturday, Oct. 23 *at Millersville 1:30

The Warriors throttled the Marauders in a 44-3 win last fall, yielding just a field goal on the final play of the first half. Freshmen Eric Deery (102 yards) and Kendrick Williams (96 yards) led the ground attack and the defense forced four of its PSAC-best 33 turnovers.

Saturday, Oct. 30 *CHEYNEY 1:00

All-American Matt Freed (12 tackles) and the defense pitched its first shutout since 2006 with a 37-0 win at Cheyney. Deery ran for 128 yards and Marshall (10-17, 195 yds, 2 TD) and Ray Wagner (3-4, 87 yds, TD) helped ESU extend its streak vs. the Wolves to 30.

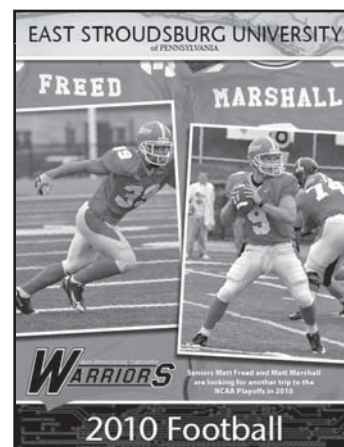
Saturday, Nov. 6 *SHIPPENSBURG 1:00

Shippensburg began its PSAC championship campaign with a 38-14 victory over the Warriors in last year's conference opener. ESU is 6-15-1 on the road at Ship, while the record at Eiler-Martin Stadium is deadlocked at 11-11-1 entering this year's meeting.

Saturday, Nov. 13 at Edinboro 12:00

Edinboro's 31-16 win at Eiler-Martin Stadium in the first round of the NCAA Playoffs was the eighth meeting between the eastern and western-most schools in the PSAC since 2000. Both squads have aspirations of playing in the PSAC title game this weekend.

Greg Knowlden

Sports Information Director

Greg Knowlden is in his fourth year as Sports Information Director at East Stroudsburg University. He came to ESU in April 2007 and is responsible for the publicity of the school's 21 varsity sports.

Knowlden previously worked at Lafayette College, where he was a member of the Athletic Communications staff for three years, including the last two as Assistant Sports Information Director.

He began his tenure at Lafayette as the Athletic Communications Graduate Intern and was promoted to Assistant SID the following year. He served as the primary contact for 20 of the Leopards' 23 NCAA Division I intercollegiate athletic programs during his time at Lafayette, including the 2005 and 2006 Patriot League champion football teams which competed in the NCAA Playoffs both seasons.

A 2003 graduate of Grove City College with a bachelor's degree in Political Science, Knowlden earned a Master's degree in Sport Management from ESU in 2004 while he was the Sports Information Graduate Assistant.

Professionally, Knowlden is a member of CoSIDA and ECAC-SIDA. ESU has had 10 student-athletes named to their respective *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District II teams in each of the last three years, an honor that is nominated and voted on by CoSIDA members.

Knowlden is a native of Muncy, Pa. and resides in East Stroudsburg.

Press Credentials

Press credentials and sidelines passes for working photographers may be obtained by writing or calling the sports information office by Thursday the week of each game. Please understand that seating in the press box is limited. Photographers must adhere to NCAA guidelines when on the sidelines.

Pre-Game Information

Numerical rosters of both teams, pre-game releases and statistics are available before the game in the press box.

The Press Box

The Eiler-Martin Stadium press box was built in 1988. The press box is fully-enclosed and air-conditioned. It includes booths to accommodate radio and television crews, newspaper reporters and members of the coaching staffs of each team.

The main press room is on the 50-yard line with large picture windows that allow

the media to see the entire field.

No guests or scouts are allowed in the press box. Alternate seating arrangements for scouts on tables at the top of the bleachers will be made.

There is no cheering allowed in the press box. Refreshments are provided at halftime.

Telephones

There are four telephone lines in the press box. Three are for radio stations, including the station covering the visiting team, and the fourth is an outside line.

Phones are available for the press to file stories either in the press box or in the Koehler Fieldhouse after the game.

Post-Game Interviews

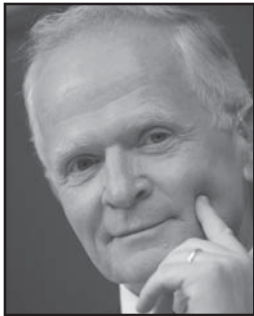
ESU head coach Denny Douds will be available in the conference room of the LeRoy J. Koehler Fieldhouse approximately 15 minutes after the game for interviews. ESU's top players in the game will be interviewed first on the sidelines by Blue Ridge Cable television and then in the press box by WVPO and WESS radio. They will be available to the print media once those obligations are completed.

The ESU locker room will be open to the press approximately 15 minutes after the game.

Statistics

Full game statistics are provided at halftime and following the game, including a complete play-by-play and game summary. Updated statistics are also available on monitors in the press box, and live statistics are available to the public on the ESU athletics website.

Dr. Robert J. Dillman
President



Dr. Robert J. Dillman has been president of East Stroudsburg University since 1996. During his tenure, the university has experienced transformative progress, ranging from new

construction, to campus beautification, academic enhancements and significant advances and upgrades for athletic programs and facilities.

Dr. Dillman has taken an active role in athletics and has been the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the PSAC since 2004-05.

Eiler-Martin Stadium has undergone major upgrades under the president's direction. FieldTurf was installed prior to the 2008 season to give ESU a durable, all-weather surface at one of the premier venues in the PSAC. Lights were installed in 2007 and night games were played for the first time in school history, and the track was resurfaced and expanded to eight lanes in 2005.

Numerous new undergraduate and graduate degree programs have also been added and academic accreditations achieved during Dr. Dillman's 14-year tenure at ESU.

The president has spearheaded several building projects at ESU, including: the state-of-the-art \$44 million Hoeffner Science and Technology Center, the first new major academic building at ESU since 1979 which opened in 2008; a student Recreation Center; the Ahnert Alumni Center, which houses the Office of Advancement and Alumni Relations; University Ridge, a 10 building apartment-style student housing complex; and a Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship that will result in an economic impact of \$57 million in Monroe County.

Other campus capital improvements include an admissions center addition in the Reibman Administration Building and a major safety, storm water management and beautification project that was completed in the summer of 2008.

While in college, Dillman competed in four sports — soccer, baseball, basketball and track & field — at SUNY New Paltz.

Dr. Dillman came to ESU from Fairmont (W.V.) State where he was president for eight years. He earned a master's degree at Penn State University and a Ph.D from Clark University, both in geography.

Dr. Tom Gioglio
Athletic Director



Dr. Tom Gioglio is in his seventh year as the Director of Athletics at East Stroudsburg University. As the Director of Athletics he is responsible for providing leadership and oversight to all operations of the

department of athletics, which is comprised of 21 varsity teams, approximately 500 student athletes and a staff of over 60.

Since assuming control of the athletic department, Gioglio has hit the ground running, incorporating many strategic initiatives for the betterment of Warrior athletics. Most notable is the 3 million dollar plus athletic facility renovations that have been completed, including the installation of FieldTurf at Eiler-Martin Stadium and Whitenight Field, lighting and outdoor Olympic track at Eiler-Martin Stadium and dugouts at Mitterling Field. There has also been a significant increase in overall attendance and revenue fundraised during Gioglio's tenure due to the enhanced promotions, marketing and sponsorship initiatives implemented through the Warrior Athletic Club, including the Television Fundraising Auction.

Gioglio has also had impact nationally and in the community. He has served as a facilitator of the NCAA Division II Leadership Academy, is a member of the NCAA Division II Wrestling Committee, and is the chair of the PSAC Executive Committee of Athletic Administrators.

He is the chair of the Monroe County United Way Day of Caring and is a board member of the Stroudsburg Little League. On campus, Gioglio's involvement includes membership on the President's Commission for Racial and Ethnic Diversity, SACE, SAAC, and the Intercollegiate Athletic Committee.

A native of nearby Morristown, N.J., Gioglio previously served as Director of Athletics at Dakota State University (S.D.) and the University of Saint Mary in Kansas.

Gioglio earned his bachelor's degree in Physical Education at Montclair State University and his first master's degree in education at Mansfield University, and his second at Northern State in Aberdeen, S.D. He also holds a doctorate degree from West Virginia University.

Gioglio and his wife Melissa are the proud parents of two daughters, Kalista and Kinley.

Dr. Carey Snyder
Associate Athletic Director



Dr. Carey Snyder is in her 23rd year in the athletic department at East Stroudsburg University.

She has served as associate athletic director the past 22 years and is ESU's

Senior Women's Administrator. In addition to other responsibilities, she processes student-athlete eligibility, serves as the NCAA compliance officer, and maintains the budget for the 21-sport intercollegiate athletic program.

Snyder prepares all athletic department comprehensive reports for the federal government and the NCAA. For 17 years, prior to 2005, she also coordinated event management for over 400 athletic contests annually.

She manages the athletic operating budget, away contests, team travel, contracts and non-session arrangements.

Snyder was the founder and chair of the Women's Athletic Scholarship Golf Classic that raised over \$150,000 in scholarships for women student-athletes. She currently organizes a highly popular National Girls and Women in Sports Day event for girls in the Stroudsburg community, is a member of the Intercollegiate Athletic Committee and the Gender Equity Planning Committee, and has also served on the University Faculty Senate.

Prior to ESU, Snyder had a highly successful career as a volleyball and softball coach at California Lutheran University in Thousand Oaks, California.

She earned her B.S. from Springfield College in Physical Education and her Master's degree and Ph.D. in Athletic Administration from the University of Southern California.

HEAD COACH DENNY DOUDS

Denny Douds, the all-time winningest coach in the history of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, enters his 37th season as the head football coach at East Stroudsburg University.

Douds is one of five active coaches in NCAA Division II, and one of just 18 coaches in all of college football, with at least 200 career victories, as he enters the 2010 campaign with a record of 226-146-3 (.607). He is the fourth-longest tenured coach among those with 200 victories and one of six to spend his entire career at the same institution.

Douds' coaching career at ESU will span 45 years and six decades when the 2010 season kicks off this fall. He took over as head coach in 1974 after eight years as an assistant coach and has been part of 271 of the 442 wins in program history. As head coach, he has mentored 19 Associated Press Little All-Americans, five AFCA All-Americans and five finalists for the Harlon Hill Award, including quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger, who won the award in 2005.

The last decade featured a 77-34 record, nine winning seasons, three NCAA Division II Playoff appearances and two PSAC East championships.

The Warriors made their fourth-ever trip to the NCAA postseason – all under Douds' leadership – in 2009, with an 8-3 regular season record before falling to Edinboro in the first round of the playoffs. ESU went 9-2 in 2008, which included the PSAC record-setting 213th win of Douds' career with a 44-41 overtime victory against Shippensburg.

ESU's other NCAA Division II Playoff trips came in 1991, 2004 and 2005. In 2005, the Warriors won three straight playoff games to claim the Northeast Region championship before bowing out in the national semifinals. ESU's 11-3 record set a school record for wins in



a single season.

ESU's seven straight winning seasons from 2000-06 was the longest such streak of Douds' career. The Warriors put together six consecutive winning seasons from 1975-1980 after going 5-5 in Douds' first season at the helm, and he has sported a winning record as a head coach ever since.

The senior head football coach in the PSAC continues to bring the same love and enthusiasm for coaching young men as when he took over as head coach in 1974.

A native of Indiana, Pa., Douds was a high school coach in Erie, Pa. for two years and an assistant coach at West Virginia University for one year before accepting an assistant coach position at ESU in 1966.

He started as the Warriors' tight ends and linebackers coach under head coach Charlie Reese, and then became the team's defensive coordinator in 1968. After eight seasons assisting Reese, Douds took over as the school's eighth head football coach.

Dating back to Jack Gregory (1959-65) and Reese (1966-73), ESU has had just three head football coaches in the last half-century.

Under Douds' direction, the Warriors have captured nine PSAC Eastern Division titles with solo first-place finishes in 1975, 1976, 1978,

1982, 1983 and 1991 and ties for the top spot in 1980, 2002 and 2003.

Before the PSAC championship game was eliminated in 1987, the Warriors won overall crowns in 1975, 1978 and 1982 and tied for the title with Shippensburg in 1976.

The 1975 and 1976 teams were both unbeaten and compiled a 19-game winning streak before the 14-14 tie with Shippensburg in the 1976 PSAC title game. The 1978 squad finished 10-1 and scored the most one-sided win in PSAC championship game history, winning 49-4 over Clarion.

The 1982 team won the school's first ever Lambert Trophy as the top Division II football

team in the East and was selected as the ECAC Division II Team of the Year.

The 1991 squad gained the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff berth after winning the PSAC Eastern Division title, while the 2004 team advanced to the second round of the playoffs and tied the previous school record for wins with a 10-2 mark.

The 2005 team broke the school record with 11 wins, won the Lambert Trophy and produced five All-America selections. Record-setting quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger received the Harlon Hill Award as the most outstanding player in Division II football, and was joined on All-America teams by kicker Mark Brubaker, fullback Anthony Carfagno, punter Ken Parrish and wide receiver Evan Prall. Other recent All-Americans include Nick Krut, the nation's leading punter in 2008, and two-time All-America linebacker Matt Freed in 2008 and 2009.

Terwilliger, the son of offensive coordinator Mike Terwilliger, has played a significant role in the latest chapter of Douds' career. Terwilliger graduated in 2006 with 16 ESU and 18 NCAA records, including tying the all-division record with 148 touchdown passes. He also holds Division II records for passing yards (14,350) and total offense (16,064). Terwilliger threw for 4,571 yards and 50 TDs to claim the Harlon Hill Award as a junior.

Douds has been honored by his peers many times. He was named the Kodak College Division Coach of the Year three times (1975, 1976, 1982), the PSAC Coach of the Year twice (1975, 1978) and the PSAC East Coach of the Year three times (1976, 1982, 2002).

In 1976, he was the first unanimous winner of the Stan Lomax-Irving T. Marsh Award as selected by the New York Football Writers' Association as the Eastern College Division Coach of the Year.

As a player, Douds was a standout lineman for Slippery Rock University as a right guard on offense and a nose tackle on defense. His play earned him All-Conference, All-State and NAIA All-America honors. He was named the school's outstanding senior athlete in 1962-63.

That same year, Douds was co-captain of the Slippery Rock football team which won the conference title by beating ESSC, 13-6, in the 1962 State Game.

He has been an active member of the American Football Coaches' Association and is an active volunteer for charitable and church activities in the community.

In addition to his football coaching duties at ESU, Douds is an assistant professor of Sport Studies. He is one of the few PSAC head coaches who also teach in the classroom.

He is a member of four Athletic Halls of Fame — ESU, Slippery Rock University, Indiana County and Northeast Pennsylvania. He was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998.

Douds and his wife Judy, also a Slippery Rock graduate, have been married for 46 years and have two children and five grandchildren.

Mike Terwilliger

Offensive Coordinator



Mike Terwilliger, a member of the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame as a player and a coach, enters his 37th year at ESU and his 33rd as an assistant coach. In 2006, Terwilliger was recognized by the

American Football Coaches Association as the Division II Assistant Coach of the Year.

Terwilliger has been involved in every game that Denny Douds has been on the sidelines as a head coach. He was a four-year starter at quarterback for the Warriors from 1974-77, and has been an assistant coach since graduating in the spring of 1978 with a degree in health and physical education. He also holds a Master's degree in physical education from Temple University, which he earned in 1983.

Terwilliger has been the offensive coordinator since 2001 and has led a record-setting offense that has averaged more than 30 points per game over the last seven years.

His son Jimmy directed the offense from 2003 through 2006 and left with 16 ESU records and 18 NCAA records, including Division II standards for passing yards (14,350), total offense (16,064) and passing touchdowns (148). Jimmy was a three-time selection as the PSAC East Offensive Player of the Year and won the Harlon Hill Award in 2005 as the most outstanding player in Division II football.

In 2005, the Warriors averaged 42.6 points per game and 508.4 yards of total offense as they won the Division II Northeast Region championship and advanced to the national semifinals for the first time in school history. The younger Terwilliger threw for 4,571 yards and 50 touchdowns, while the

rushing game averaged 163 yards per game.

The 2004 Warriors recorded nearly 500 yards of total offense per game and Jimmy Terwilliger led the nation in pass efficiency while throwing for 3,826 yards, the third-highest total in PSAC history. In 2003, Terwilliger set the Division II record for total offense by a freshman.

As ESU's quarterback coach since 1978, Terwilliger has tutored all of his successors at the position. His teaching has helped standout quarterbacks Damian Poalucci, an NCAA record-holder, along with Andy Baranak, Bret Comp, James Franklin, Jeremy Palm, Tim Roken and current starter Matt Marshall establish school passing records.

Terwilliger was one of the finest quarterbacks in the school's history, leading the Warriors to undefeated seasons and PSAC championships in 1975 and 1976 in his four years as a starter. He was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1994.

After taking over as a starter early in his freshman year, Terwilliger guided the Warriors to a 30-4-1 record over four seasons. He earned All-Conference first team honors twice and was also an Associated Press Little All-American. He threw for 3,799 yards and 33 touchdowns in his playing career.

Terwilliger and his wife Kim are the parents of three children. Jimmy is a health and physical education teacher and the head football coach at Pleasant Valley High School, Kelly is a graduate student at Ohio University and played field hockey at Ohio State, and Jackie is a junior at East Stroudsburg University. The Terwilligers live in East Stroudsburg.

Mike Santella

Offensive Line/ Recruiting Coordinator



Mike Santella is in his 13th season as an assistant coach at his alma mater, and his 10th as the full-time offensive line coach. He has also served as the Warriors' recruiting coordinator since returning to ESU prior

to the 2001 season.

A 1994 graduate of ESU, Santella has made an impact as an assistant coach for two championship NCAA Division I-AA programs, and two NCAA Division II Playoff teams at ESU, during his coaching career.

His front five has provided the protection for the Warriors' record-setting offensive performances since he became the offensive line coach, and was instrumental in Jimmy Terwilliger's Harlon Hill campaign in 2005. ESU averaged nearly 500 yards of total offense and more than 35 points per game from 2004 through 2006.

Santella has coached 14 All-PSAC selections and has had at least one All-PSAC offensive lineman in the last nine years. Morgan Thomas (2008-09), Mike Habel (2007-08), Dan Crozier (2004-05), Greg Munch (2002-03) and Joe Burton (2001-02) were all two-time All-PSAC honorees under Santella's mentorship. Keith Weaver (2008), Jeff Kocsis (2005), Colin Delaney (2004) and Jim Sodano (2001) were also all-conference selections.

He was a part-time assistant coach for the Warriors in both 1998 and 1999, working with the offensive line, and was a student coach in the fall of 1994 after receiving his bachelor's degree in physical education.

A native of Bethlehem, Pa., Santella went home to join the coaching staff at Lehigh University where he was an assistant for three years. He worked with the offensive line in 1995, coached the tight ends in 1996 and was the running backs coach in 1997.

Lehigh won the 1995 Patriot League championship in Santella's first year on the staff, and tailback Rabih Abdullah was a first team all-league selection and went on to play in the NFL.

In 2000, Santella was the tight ends coach at the University of Pennsylvania and helped the Quakers claim the Ivy League championship with a 7-3 record. The Quakers had the number one passing offense in I-AA football.

Henry Baker

Defensive Backs



Henry Baker enters his first season as defensive backs coach at East Stroudsburg University in the fall of 2010.

Baker arrives at ESU after spending two seasons as a defensive graduate

assistant under head coach Ralph Friedgen at Maryland, which included the 2009 Rowdy Humanitarian Bowl championship team which finished with an 8-5 record. He was the interim inside linebackers coach for the Terrapins' bowl game and worked with the secondary, linebackers and special teams during his time in College Park.

A four-year letterwinner and two-year starter at defensive back at Maryland from 1994-97, Baker was a candidate for his Master's degree in Education-Minority and Urban Education in May 2010 and earned his bachelor's degree in Sociology in 2003.

Baker previously served as Maryland's recruiting intern in 2001 and has high school coaching experience at Eastside High School in Paterson, N.J. (2003, 2005-06) and South Miami (Fla.) High School in 2007 before returning to his alma mater. His time at Eastside included an appearance in the New Jersey Group IV Section 1 state championship game.

He also spent extensive time in professional football, landing in the NFL with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2003, and competed in the Arena Football League with the New Jersey Red Dogs and Carolina Cobras and AFL2 with the Norfolk Nighthawks and Albany Firebirds.

Baker worked with James Franklin (ESU '95), the Terrapins' offensive coordinator, during both of his stints at Maryland. Franklin was the Warriors' starting quarterback in 1993 and 1994, a candidate for the Harlon Hill Award as the outstanding player in Division II as a senior and was named the eventual successor to Friedgen as Maryland's head coach in February 2010.

Nick Bach is in his third season as an assistant at ESU as the defensive ends coach and the Warriors' video coordinator. He coached defensive tackle Miguel Rivera (2008) and defensive end Jeff Case (2009) to

All-PSAC East status in his first two years.

Bach came to ESU from Otterbein College, where he was a graduate assistant defensive line coach for three seasons and coached three all-conference players in 2006. He was also the assistant strength and conditioning coordinator and video coordinator, and coached special teams and running backs with the Cardinals.

He coached the defensive line at Johns Hopkins University in 2003 and helped the Bluejays to a 10-1 season. He has also spent two seasons as a high school coach, serving as defensive coordinator and offensive line coach for the junior varsity programs at Canisius (N.Y.) in 2001 and Cardinal O'Hara (N.Y.) in 2000.

Bach played defensive end in college, earning two letters at Buffalo State before suffering a career-ending injury his junior season, and was Rookie of the Year as a sophomore. He also lettered at Canisius College as a freshman.

Bach earned his bachelor's degree in health and wellness from Buffalo State in 2001 and his Master's degree in Teaching from Otterbein in 2007.

Joey Smith, who played in the NFL for four years with the New York Giants, is in his 10th season as

outside linebackers coach at ESU. He also coaches the returners on special teams.

Smith returned kickoffs and punts and also saw action at wide receiver and defensive back for the Giants from 1991-94. He was a defensive back and kick returner at the University of Louisville and played on the Cardinals' 1990 Fiesta Bowl championship team. Smith graduated from Louisville in 1991.

Frank Lupin

Wide Receivers



Frank Lupin enters his 50th year in coaching in the 2010 season, and his 29th year as an assistant coach at ESU. Including his eight years as a player, four in high school and four for the Warriors, this

fall will mark Lupin's 58th year in football.

Lupin was recognized for his long-time contributions to Warrior football when he was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in the fall of 2002. He was a player for the Warriors from 1957-60, served as a freshman coach in 1961, and returned to ESU in 1983 where he has been a member of the coaching staff ever since.

Lupin has developed all-conference, record-breaking pass catchers nearly every year since his return. He has coached almost all of the top receivers in school history, including Evan Prall, who set PSAC records with 4,093 yards receiving and 50 touchdowns in his career, and also holds the ESU school record with 236 receptions.

Prall was a two-time All-America selection and set PSAC marks with 1,766 yards receiving and 23 touchdowns as a junior in 2005. Jeff Giglio, Drew Stem, Sam Shuman, Tim Strenfel, John Jeffries, Justin Kondikoff and John Kotorsky have also been All-PSAC selections at wide receiver since 2000. The 1996 and 2005 teams both featured a pair of 1,000-yard pass catchers and eight players have gone over 2,000 career receiving yards.

As a player at ESU, Lupin was one of the Warriors' top running backs under head coach Jack Gregory from 1957-60. As a senior, he averaged 7.3 yards per carry, fourth-best in school history, with 313 yards on 43 rushing attempts.

After leaving ESU, Lupin was an assistant coach at Binghamton (N.Y.) North High School from 1962-67, and was head coach at Waverly (N.Y.) High School from 1968-79. Lupin returned to the Poconos in 1980 and was the head coach at Pocono Mountain High School for three seasons before taking a position on the ESU coaching staff.

Lupin retired from teaching in 2003 and was a physical education teacher at the Pocono Elementary Center in Tannersville. He earned his bachelor's degree in health and physical education from ESU in 1962, and his Master's degree in physical education in 1978.

Ed Lynett Defensive Line



Ed Lynett joins the coaching staff at East Stroudsburg University for the 2010 season.

Lynett comes to ESU from Bucknell, where he coached the safeties last fall. He was previously the defensive coordinator

and defensive backs coach at Iona for four seasons before the school dropped its program following the 2008 campaign.

Lynett helped the Gaels defensive unit become one of the best in the country during his tenure at Iona. His charges ranked third nationally in total defense in 2006 (232.0) and 2007 (271.5), and also ranked third in rushing defense in 2006, allowing 66.9 yards per game.

Lynett, who coached 16 all-conference players and a pair of Mid-Major All-Americans at Iona, served as the acting head coach against Columbia during the 2006 season.

He arrived at Iona after two years as an assistant at Lehigh in 2003 and 2004, where he coached the defensive line and assisted with special teams. In addition to his duties with the varsity team, Lynett served as the head coach of the junior varsity squad.

Lynett also served as a graduate assistant at Colorado State, where he worked with the defensive line and defensive backs, along with five seasons as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Scranton Prep.

Lynett played collegiately at Fordham, where he was a three-year letterwinner as a running back and defensive back and graduated with a degree in Marketing/Managerial Accounting in 1992.

Rob Mikulski Strength & Conditioning



Rob Mikulski is in his 24th year as the strength and conditioning coach at ESU.

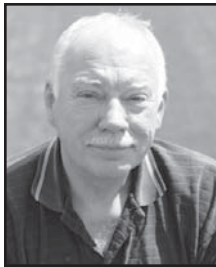
In 2005, he was named the Division II Strength and Conditioning Coach of the Year by American

Our Home — Eiler-Martin Stadium



The Warriors made their debut on the FieldTurf at Eiler-Martin Stadium against Virginia Union on August 28, 2008.

East Stroudsburg University's Eiler-Martin Stadium is named in honor of **John R. Eiler**, an outstanding athlete at the school in the early 1930s and later athletic director and a championship soccer coach, and the late **Gene Martin**, the Warriors' head football coach from 1942-57 and the school's long-time Dean of Men.

Formerly swamp land in 1932, today's stadium and field were filled in by East Stroudsburg State Teachers' College students working in federal work programs instituted after Franklin Roosevelt was elected president in 1932. Many football players at the time were members of the work crew.

Dedication ceremonies were held on Oct. 22, 1938, before a football game against Cortland State. There was a parade to the stadium which included both football teams, members of all other

athletic teams in full uniform, students in the Physical Education and Health program, municipal and college officials, and even game officials.

New home bleachers were added in 1960 while a fully enclosed, air-conditioned press box was installed in 1988 and new away bleachers were added in 1989. Also in 1988, an electronic message center scoreboard was erected at the south end of the field.

The stadium has undergone three major upgrades in the past five years, including the installation of FieldTurf in the summer of 2008 that gives ESU a sparkling multi-use facility. Lights were added in the spring of 2007 which made night games possible for the first time in school history. The track was resurfaced and expanded to eight lanes for the Warriors' track and field program in 2005.

Student-Athlete Center for Excellence

In 1998, ESU established a Student-Athlete Center for Excellence on campus. The center includes experts in exercise physiology, nutrition, academic counseling, psychological counseling and sport studies.

Greenawalt has 26 years of experience in higher education, including 14

years at Albright College and 12 at ESU. During her time at Albright, she worked as the Associate Athletic Director for Women and Physical Education Department Chairperson. She has also served on numerous NCAA, national and regional committees.

A 1978 graduate of Albright College, Greenawalt was inducted into the Albright Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997 for her achievements earned as a five-sport student-athlete and head coach for volleyball, badminton and tennis. She earned her bachelor's degree in psychology from Albright and her master's degree in physical education from Penn State University.

2010 OUTLOOK

East Stroudsburg University opened the 2009 football season with one of the youngest squads in **Denny Douds'** 36-year tenure as head coach, and finished it with the fourth trip to the NCAA Division II Playoffs in school history.

The Warriors featured 43 true or redshirt freshmen a year ago while replacing 16 starters, and bring back a veteran roster that is capable of contending for another NCAA playoff berth and the 10th PSAC championship in Douds' legendary career.

A pair of redshirt seniors, linebacker **Matt Freed** and quarterback **Matt Marshall**, will be integral to the Warriors' postseason plans this fall.

Freed has garnered a mantel full of awards during the last two years, with back-to-back AP Little All-America and Daktronics Division II All-America honors, along with ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America first team status in 2009. The outside linebacker led the PSAC with 132 tackles, 18 tackles for a loss and 10 sacks a year ago and is one of seven returning starters on the Warriors' defense.

Marshall leads a group of eight offensive starters who are back in the fold after putting together one of the top seasons by a signal caller in school history. He will have a number of playmakers at his disposal on an offense that has consistently ranked as one of the top units in the PSAC.

OFFENSE

Marshall had an outstanding season in his first full year as a starter, joining Bret Comp (1991) and Jimmy Terwilliger (2004-05) as quarterbacks who have led the Warriors to the NCAA Playoffs. He brings a 10-4 record as a starter into his senior season, going 8-4 a year ago and winning his first two career starts in 2008.

Statistically, Marshall ranked second in the PSAC in pass efficiency (150.3) and third in passing yards (244.8) and total offense (270.9) per game. He threw for 2,938 yards and 26 touchdowns, rushed for 313 yards and another score and proved a worthy successor in the lineage of ESU quarterbacks. He ranked sixth in school history in a number of offensive categories, trailing only Harlon Hill winner Terwilliger's four-year career and ESU Hall of Famer Damian Poalucci's NCAA record-setting 1996 campaign.

His 2009 season was highlighted by a fourth quarter comeback in a 21-20 win at West Chester and a 430-yard, two TD performance in a 27-20 overtime victory at Kutztown. He had 360 yards of total offense (301 passing) vs. Edinboro in the NCAA Playoffs and went 23-for-29 for 316 yards in an early season victory over Clarion.

Redshirt junior **Ray Wagner** and redshirt freshman **Nate Daniels** will back up Marshall during his senior season. Wagner was 10-for-17 for 184 yards and two TDs over six games a year ago and Daniels, an All-State selection (AAAA) at Muhlenberg HS, is also waiting in the wings.

Redshirt seniors **Jeff Giglio** and **Ed Kiser** have been on the other end of most of Marshall's aeriels over the past 14 games and give the Warriors two of the fastest receivers in the PSAC.

Giglio was off to a sensational start in 2009 before being derailed by injury in the second half of the year. He was sixth in Division II in receiving through the first four weeks, averaging 118.2 yards per game, and finished the year with 38 catches, 603 yards and a spot on the All-PSAC East second team. That followed a breakout 2008 season (41 catches, 749 yards, 10 TD) which featured 301 yards over the final two games, the start of a six-game stretch where he had 39 catches for 774 yards and five TDs.

Kiser put together a breakout season of his own in 2009, leading the Warriors with 43 catches for 805 yards and scoring six TDs. He was also one of the top all-purpose yardage gainers in the PSAC, averaging 22.8 yards on kick returns and carrying nine times for 81 yards on the season. He had 11 catches for 177 yards, including the go-ahead TD, in an overtime win at Kutztown and has caught a pass in all 23 games over the last two years.

The rest of the wide receiving corps is headlined by a pair of players who saw their first career action last fall, redshirt sophomore **Jordan Hallman** and true sophomore **Bryan Ogden**.

Hallman was third on the squad with 29 catches and had 359 yards and six TDs. He pulled in the game-winning five-yard TD at West Chester and had five catches for 102 yards and two scores vs. Slippery Rock in the regular season finale. Ogden saw action in 10 games, ranking third on the team with 367 yards on 26 catches. He caught a three-yard TD pass vs. Edinboro and had his first career 100-yard game two weeks earlier with 106 yards vs. Millersville.

A host of talented receivers will also press for time on the field. Redshirt sophomore **Wade Williams**, an All-State pick at Pius X in 2006 and 2007, played in eight games a year ago. Redshirt freshman **Robert Bleiler** is expected to contribute right away, and redshirt sophomore **Jameel Seymour** and redshirt freshmen **Travis China** and **David Radziak** will all look to earn playing time and catch passes in 2010.

For all of the depth at wide receiver, Douds and the offensive coaching staff of coordinator Mike Terwilliger and line coach

Mike Santella may be even more excited about the stable of tailbacks that made their way to ESU a year ago.

The Warriors intended to redshirt **Eric Deery**, **Joe Klebon** and **Kendrick Williams**, but Deery and Williams were pressed into action when starter Zach Krise was beset by a number of injuries after running for 384 yards and three TDs in the first three games.

Williams saw his first career action on the crucial fourth quarter TD drive at West Chester, carrying six times for 50 yards on an eight-play march, and started the final six games of the year. He averaged 97.3 all-purpose yards per game as a threat on the ground (436 yards, 4.4 avg., 3 TD) and through the air (12 catches, 245 yards, TD).

Deery produced two 100-yard rushing games, with 121 yards at Cheyney and 102 vs. Millersville, while showcasing his speed to get to the edge of the defense.

The coaches were able to maintain Klebon's redshirt status and are ready to get the former first team All-State selection at Riverside HS on the field. Freshman **Dusty Reed**, an All-State performer at Delone Catholic and the nephew of ESU Hall of Fame offensive lineman Pat Flaherty, is the top incoming prospect at the position.

At fullback, redshirt senior **Brent Jones** was the Warriors' top goal-line option last year, with five one-yard TD runs. He had 13 carries and 10 catches last season and should be a valuable part of the offense this year. Freshmen **Darius Jackson**, who went through spring practice with the Warriors, and **Taylor Newcomer** will provide depth.

Redshirt senior **Matt Brown** returns for his sixth season at tight end after receiving for a medical redshirt in 2008. He has played in parts of four seasons, including all 12 games last year, and will be backed up by freshmen **Nick Hagemann** and **Steven Jones**, who was a member of the 2009 AAAA championship team at La Salle College HS.

Four of the Warriors' five starters on the offensive line return in redshirt juniors **Dan Caffrey** and **Zach Sarginger** and redshirt sophomores **Seve Rivers** and **Wrenton Wright II**.

A year ago, Morgan Thomas was one of two returning starters on line and was a first team All-PSAC East and second team All-Region choice at left tackle. Wright, the starter in all 12 games at right tackle in 2009, is expected to make the transition to the left side this year and has All-PSAC potential.

Caffrey has started at center in all 23 games of his career, while Sarginger, an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District selection last fall, started all 12 games at right guard and is projected to slide to right tackle. Rivers started the first nine games at left guard last

year before suffering a season-ending injury vs. Millersville.

The final spot is expected to be filled by either senior **Mike Dimitriou**, who was used as an offensive lineman, tight end and fullback in his first year at ESU, or redshirt freshman **Greg Blue**, a highly-regarded prospect from Unionville HS. Redshirt freshman **Joe Palma**, junior transfer **Vinnie Bonavita** and freshmen **Jordan Kain** and **John Frisbie** will also push for playing time.

DEFENSE

Freed enters his senior season as one of the premier players in the country on either side of the ball and leads a defense that ranked in the top 10 in Division II in red zone defense, fourth down defense and takeaways in 2009.

Individually, he has led the PSAC in tackles each of the last two years and has 258 tackles, 29.0 TFL and 14.0 sacks in that span, with at least 10 tackles in 16 of the Warriors' 23 games. Last season he turned in two of the top single-game performances in the nation, with 14 solo tackles at Kutztown and 20 tackles (13 solo), 4.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks vs. Slippery Rock.

The Warriors' linebackers should be among the best at their position in the region, as five players have starting experience. Freed and senior **Mark Kalo** are lined up on the outside, with senior **Kevin Schafer**, redshirt junior **Taylor Cave** and junior **Mike Bergey** on the inside.

Kalo made 75 tackles and led the PSAC with four forced fumbles last year while showcasing his versatility, lining up in a hybrid safety position on passing downs in the Warriors' 4-4 defensive alignment.

Schafer is also a three-year letterwinner and made seven starts while being limited by injury in 2009. He had 25 tackles in the first three games and had 38 tackles on the year.

Cave was the Warriors' second-leading tackler with 76 stops in his first year as a starter. He was also strong in pass coverage, with two interceptions, including a 26-yard return for a TD vs. Clarion, and six pass breakups. Bergey, the only true freshman to letter in 2008, was a starter in five games last season and had 70 tackles.

A host of players will fight for backup roles and also contribute on special teams, where the Warriors regularly have one of the top units in the PSAC on kickoffs and punts.

Outside linebackers include senior **Richard Peter**, redshirt junior **Bryan Billger**, redshirt freshman **Thomas Chesko** and freshmen **Derek Brown**, **Tyler Burke** and **Gabe Ostrow**. Brown, the brother of tight end Matt Brown, comes to ESU from Souderton HS, which has also produced

Freed, Bergey and graduate assistant Dave Lotier, a three-year starter from 2005-07, at linebacker for the Warriors over the past five years.

Potential contributors at inside linebacker are redshirt junior **Dennis Lynch**, junior transfer **Chris Yoo** and freshman **Don Kinney, Jr.**

The defensive backfield should be strong as well with both starting cornerbacks returning in senior **David Castillo** and redshirt junior **Shawnte Carroll**.

Castillo has started the Warriors' last 28 games at corner and may be, pound-for-pound, the strongest player on the team. He has six interceptions and 23 pass breakups in his career while developing into one of top cornerbacks in the PSAC.

Carroll was a first-year starter last year and etched his name in the NCAA record book with three interceptions in the fourth quarter vs. Slippery Rock to tie a Division II record. His four picks in the game, including two returns for scores, set the school record and should be the springboard for another productive season in 2010.

Sophomore **John Mack** was the Warriors' nickel back last year and should fill the same role this season. Sophomore **D'Jon Tillman** played in 11 games and freshman **Andrew Coyle**, another Souderton product, may also see the field.

At safety, three players are expected to contend for the starting spot after Nicholas Artinger had an All-Region season that included a PSAC-high seven interceptions.

The group includes junior **Herschel Thornton**, a former University of Minnesota signee after playing at Lackawanna College, redshirt sophomore **Zechariah Runkle** and freshman **David Ogbonnaya**, who may also contribute at cornerback.

The Warriors will replace three of their four starters on the defensive line in ends Jeff Case (second team All-PSAC East) and Matthew Faas and tackle Keith Galinsky.

Redshirt junior tackle **Rudy Cerami** is the only returning starter and will be joined by redshirt junior **Cody Berry**, who has contributed at tackle and end over the past two years and has 6.5 career sacks. Other contributors include redshirt sophomore **Sam Hull**, redshirt freshman **Mark Wroblewski**, redshirt junior **J.D. Howell** and freshmen **Chris King** and **Bryan Thomson**.

Both defensive ends will be first-year starters. The front runners are redshirt junior **Jon Weber**, who was a safety and linebacker before settling at end, and senior **Alex Figueroa**, a two-year letterwinner. Redshirt freshman **Scott Brimmer** and junior transfer **Brett Moss** should also be in the mix for playing time.

PSAC Overview

Originating in 1951 to administer and promote men's athletics, the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference has evolved into one of the NCAA's most heralded intercollegiate conferences.

The first major step came in 1977, when based on a growing interest, the league reorganized to provide a structure for its women's programs. Only three years later, lacking a standard competitive division, league voted to reclassify the entire conference to NCAA Division II.

The most recent enhancement came during the 2008-09 academic year when the PSAC expanded for the first time in its rich history, adding full-time members Gannon University and Mercyhurst College, and associate member Long Island University-C.W. Post. The membership now consists of 16 full-time institutions and the one associate.

All of the league's full-time members are located within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, which makes the PSAC the largest one-state conference in the NCAA. The league has also grown to share the distinctions as: The largest conference in Division II, the largest football-playing conference in the NCAA, and, with 23, the conference that sponsors the most championships at the Division II level.

Highly competitive on a regional and national level, PSAC schools annually combine to send nearly one-third of its teams into NCAA postseason play. Ultimately, the membership's success has yielded 43 NCAA team and 238 individual title winners.

While proud of its athletic accomplishments, the league also has evolved into one of Division II's finest from an academic standpoint. Today, nearly one-third of the PSAC's estimated 6,200 participants are honored each year as "Scholar-Athletes" for maintaining a grade-point average of 3.25 or better - a total that has nearly doubled since PSAC Scholar-Athletes



were first recognized in the mid-1990s.

Although all 16 current institutions are members of Division II, eight league schools also compete at the Division I level in select sports. PSAC schools enroll over 125,000 students and claim over 709,000 alumni, including 482,000 who reside in Pennsylvania.

The PSAC is governed by the presidents of the 16 member institutions. It employs a commissioner, two assistant commissioners and a director of media relations at its headquarters in Lock Haven, Pa.

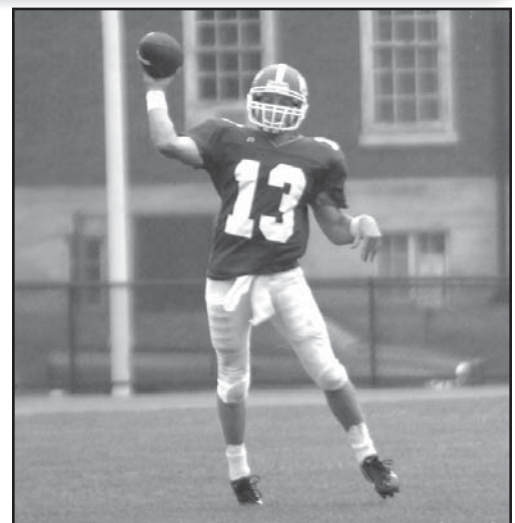
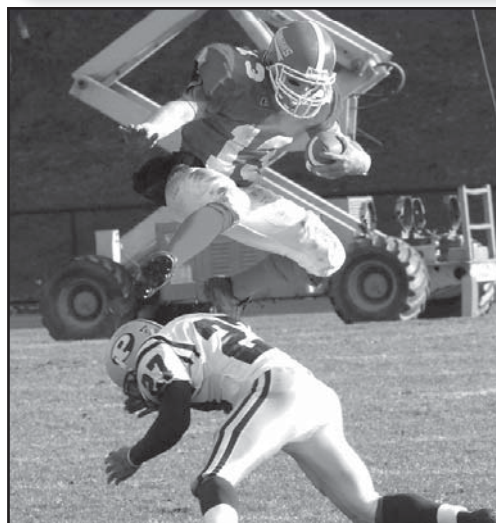

2009 Game-By-Game Recaps

Game 1 • Aug. 27 • ESU 19, Virginia Union6

RICHMOND, Va. - R-Jr. TB **Zach Krise** ran 26 times for 107 yards and a pair of two-yard touchdowns as ESU won its 2009 season opener 19-6 at Virginia Union.

R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall** completed 14 of his first 15 passes and finished the game 20-for-32 for 218 yards. Marshall also ran for 48 yards and led an ESU offense that compiled 413 yards, 26 first downs and controlled the ball for 34:35.

The Warriors opened the scoring with a six-yard pass from Marshall to R-Jr. WR **Ed Kiser** following a 15 play, 89-yard drive over 6:41 late in the first quarter. Marshall was 7-for-8 and also had a 10-yard run on the drive.

ESU went ahead 12-0 on Krise's first touchdown of the game with 11:38 left in the second quarter following a Virginia Union turnover as Jr. LB **Kevin Schafer** had a sack and forced fumble that was recovered by R-Jr. DE **Jeff Case** at the VUU 37-yard line. Marshall completed a 32-yard pass to R-Sr. WR **Sam Shuman** to overcome a 3rd-and-28 and Krise scored on third-and-one from the two-yard line.

The Panthers got on the board for the only time of the night on a 60-yard run by Tarain Donaldson (16 carries, 104 yards) with 9:58 left in the second quarter. ESU threatened twice more in the first half but didn't come away with any points, missing a 34-yard field goal and coming up empty on first-and-goal from the five, and took a 12-6 lead into the half.

Krise's second touchdown of the day gave ESU a 19-6 lead on its first possession of the second half. R-Jr. K **Drew Reinhard** made the extra point after missing his first two attempts.

The defense and the running game did the rest of the work for the Warriors, as they limited Virginia Union to 109 yards and Krise ran 17 times for 75 yards after intermission.

Kiser (4 catches, 75 yards), Shuman (5-76) and R-Jr. WR **Jeff Giglio** (6-69) led the Warriors' receiving corps and Shuman also threw a 52-yard pass to Kiser.

R-Jr. OLB **Matt Freed**, an All-American in 2008, had eight tackles and one of the Warriors' four sacks. Case had seven tackles (2.5 for a loss), a sack and a fumble recovery and Fr. CB **John Mack** also recovered a fumble in the third quarter.

Game 2 • Sept. 5 • ESU 38, Gannon 21

ERIE - R-Jr. TB **Zach Krise** ran 184 yards, had 222 all-purpose yards and scored three touchdowns to lead ESU to a 38-21 win at Gannon.

Krise followed up his 107-yard, two touchdown performance in a 19-6 win at Virginia Union to put together the Warriors' first back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since Derek Lucas in 2004. He carried 29 times and scored two rushing touchdowns, caught five passes and had another score through the air after carrying 26 times last week.

R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall** was 20-for-28 for 269 yards and three touchdowns and hit R-Jr. WR **Jeff Giglio** seven times for 140 yards and a 10-yard TD late in the second quarter that gave the Warriors a 28-14 halftime lead.

ESU took control of the game with two scores in a 20-second stretch early in the second. Krise scored on a 14-yard pass from Marshall with 13:27 left, Gannon tailback Jon Richardson lost a fumble that was recovered by Jr. CB **David Castillo** at the 32-yard line and Marshall hit R-Fr. WR **Jordan Hallman** for a TD on the next play to put ESU ahead 21-7.

Gannon twice cut the Warriors' advantage to one touchdown, the second time on a one-yard run by

Richardson with 3:01 left in the third quarter, before ESU put together a five play, 60-yard drive capped by an 18-yard run by Krise that made the score 35-21. R-Jr. K **Drew Reinhard** added a 22-yard field goal in the fourth quarter.

Richardson ran for 113 yards and two touchdowns on 25 carries, but the Warriors limited Gannon quarterback Zach Boedicker to a 10-for-23 performance for 120 yards and two interceptions. Boedicker was 16-for-22 for 222 yards in Gannon's 35-34 win over Lake Erie last Thursday.

R-Jr. OLB **Matt Freed** had 11 tackles, Jr. OLB **Mark Kalo** had eight tackles and a sack and R-Sr. DE **Matthew Faas** also had a sack. R-So. LB **Taylor Cave** and Sr. FS **Nicholas Artinger** both had interceptions, R-Jr. DE **Jeff Case** forced a fumble and ESU created three turnovers.

Game 3 • Sept. 12 • ESU 45, Clarion 31

EAST STROUDSBURG - R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall** had the second-most accurate passing day in school history, going 23-for-29 for 316 yards and three TDs, and R-Jr. WR **Jeff Giglio** caught seven passes for 148 yards and a score as ESU improved to 3-0 with a 45-31 win over Clarion at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

Marshall completed 79.3 percent of his passes, trailing only Tom Taylor (81.0, 17-21) at Southern Connecticut in 1989, and R-Jr. TB **Zach Krise** ran for 93 yards and a touchdown on 23 carries after entering tied for fourth in Division II with 145.5 ypg.

Giglio went over 100 yards for the fourth time in his last five games and caught a 20-yard TD pass that gave ESU a 35-21 cushion with 35 seconds left in the third quarter. The Warriors led 28-14 at halftime on an eight-yard TD pass from Marshall to R-Sr. WR **Sam Shuman** with two seconds left in the half, capping an 11-play, 60-yard drive that took just 1:37.

Clarion intercepted Marshall's first pass of the day on the second play from scrimmage and converted with a 23-yard TD pass from Tyler Huether (19-for-33, 307 yards, 3 TD) to tight end Matt Foradora.

Marshall was nearly perfect after that and hit Giglio for an 86-yard gain after the ESU defense had a fourth-and-one stop inside the 20-yard line. Krise scored from one yard out to tie the game at 7-7, Marshall tossed a three-yard TD pass to R-Sr. TE **Willie Bell** and R-So. LB **Taylor Cave** capped ESU's early scoring blitz with a 26-yard interception return for a TD for a 21-7 lead 1:57 into the second quarter.

Clarion scored with 1:39 left in the half on a 20-yard TD pass from Huether to Matt Ward, and the Golden Eagles scored on their second possession of the third quarter with a five-yard run by Alfonso Hoggard. Once again Marshall came right back, going 5-for-5 including a fourth down conversion to R-Jr. WR **Ed Kiser**, and Giglio's 20-yard TD catch put the game away.

Game 4 • Sept. 19 • Shippensburg 38, ESU 14

EAST STROUDSBURG - Mike Harris caught five passes for 145 yards and two TDs and Shippensburg limited ESU to 250 yards and had seven sacks in a 38-14 win in the PSAC East opener at Seth Grove Stadium.

The Raiders (3-1, 1-0) led 17-7 at halftime and 17-14 after ESU R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall** scored on a 51-yard run early in the third quarter. Shippensburg answered with a nine play, 63-yard touchdown drive and scored the final 21 points to put the game away.

Harris, a two-time first team All-PSAC selection, gave Shippensburg a 7-0 lead three minutes into the game on an 84-yard pass from Chad DiFebbo and went up 10-0 on a 25-yard field goal by Kyler Ford.

ESU (3-1, 0-1) was in the red zone three times in the first half but didn't come away with any points on two

trips inside the five-yard line. Marshall hit R-Jr. WR **Jeff Giglio** for gains of 35 and 11 yards on the Warriors' next possession, but ultimately lost a fumble on second-and-one from the one-yard line that was recovered by safety Jamahn McCullough.

R-Jr. WR **Ed Kiser** had three catches for 89 yards on ESU's only scoring drive of the first half. He caught a 48-yard pass from Marshall and scored on a 22-yard pass to make the score 10-7 with 4:35 left in the half.

Shippensburg responded two plays later with a 69-yard run by Kevin Marshall to reestablish the 10-point lead. ESU drove deep into Ship territory late in the half with R-Sr. WR **Sam Shuman** throwing a 50-yard pass to Giglio, but the drive came up empty as R-Jr. **Drew Reinhard** missed an 18-yard field goal.

Marshall's 51-yard TD run brought ESU within 17-14 with 12:22 left in the third, but Shippensburg went the length of the field and went ahead 24-14 on a nine-yard run by fullback Kevin Herod.

ESU didn't manage another first down the rest of the game as the Raiders harassed Marshall (70.8 completion percentage, 4th in Division II) into a 9-of-20 day and recorded seven sacks. ESU was 5th in the nation on third down (55.3) but was 1-for-10.

Giglio had 100 yards receiving for the fifth time in six games and R-Jr. OLB **Matt Freed** had 10 tackles. Josh Simmons (6 tackles, 3 sacks) and Tyton Brunner (3 tackles, 2 sacks) led the Shippensburg defense.

CHEYNEY – Fr. TB **Eric Deery** ran for 121 yards, R-Fr. TB **Justin Lee** had 58 rushing yards and two TDs and R-Sr. WR **Sam Shuman** caught a pair of TD passes to lead ESU to a 37-0 win at Cheyney.

The Warriors posted their first shutout since blanking Edinboro 12-0 on the road in 2006. The win is the 30th straight over Cheyney, extending the longest streak in Division II for consecutive wins in an uninterrupted series which ESU leads 53-1.

ESU had a 16-play drive in 6:47 to set up a 25-yard field goal by R-Jr. K **Drew Reinhard** with 8:57 left in the half and Lee scored on a four-yard run with 2:20 remaining following a 12-play drive. Castillo's fifth career interception gave ESU the ball back and Lee went in from one-yard out with 33 seconds left.

ESU's third 88-yard drive was accomplished in just three plays on the first possession of the second half, capped by a 22-yard pass from Marshall to Kiser. Wagner

WEST CHESTER – R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall** threw two second-half TD passes, including the go-ahead score on a five-yard toss to R-Fr. WR **Jordan Hallman** with 6:50 left, and the defense forced two key fumbles in the fourth quarter as ESU ended a six-game losing streak against West Chester at Farrell Stadium.

The Warriors' last win in the series was a 28-27 victory in 2003 when R-Fr. Jimmy Terwilliger directed a 94-yard TD drive and hit Evan Prall for the two-point conversion with 47 seconds left.

WCU drove 55 yards after ESU went ahead and had a first down at the 13-yard line, but a false start and three incomplete passes brought on Chris Hill for a 35-yard field goal that he missed wide left.

ESU ran all but the final 3.6 seconds off the clock in the final minute and Fr. **Joseph Janovic** got off a 36-yard punt from his own end zone that the Warriors covered successfully to seal the victory.

The defense produced two turnovers after

surrendering TDs on WCU's first two drives of the second half. Jr. OLB **Mark Kalo** forced a fumble that was recovered by R-So. CB **Shawnte Carroll** at the 45-yard line to set up the go-ahead scoring drive. Fr. TB **Kendrick Williams**, seeing his first career action, carried six times for 50 yards and went 30 yards on 4th-and-one from the 35 which led to Marshall's TD pass to Hallman.

R-Sr. DL **Keith Galinsky's** sack and forced fumble, recovered by R-So. DL **Rudy Cerami**, stopped WCU's next drive before the Golden Rams' second shot at a comeback fell just short.

ESU led 7-6 at halftime before WCU QB Joe Wright led two scoring drives, throwing a 54-yard TD pass to Dan DePalma and setting up a four-yard TD run by Matt McLaughlin. The Warriors pulled within 20-14 as Marshall gained all 85 yards on a TD drive with his arm (56) and legs (29) and hit R-Jr. WR **Jeff Giglio** for a 34-yard score with 1:12 left in the third.

R-Jr. TB **Zach Krise** had 106 all-purpose yards in the first half, 42 rushing and 64 receiving, before leaving with an injury. ESU had a seven-minute edge in time of possession, ran 15 more plays (72-57) and held WCU's third-ranked rushing offense to 97 yards.

Game 7 • Oct. 10 • Bloomsburg 27, ESU 13

EAST STROUDSBURG – Derrick Price ran for 165 yards and a TD and Kenny Domzalski put the game away with a 28-yard TD run with 4:15 left as Bloomsburg defeated ESU, 27-13, on Homecoming Weekend.

The No. 5 Huskies (7-0, 4-0) went 98 yards in four plays, all on the ground, following a 50-yard punt by R-Sr. WR **Sam Shuman**, who also caught a TD pass and handled the punting for the first time at ESU.

Price broke a 59-yard run on second down from the 10 and Domzalski scored two plays later. The Huskies ran 44 times for 256 yards in the game.

The Warriors (5-2, 2-2) trailed 20-6 five minutes into the third quarter but got back in the game with an eight play, 80-yard march engineered by R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall**. Shuman hauled in a 27-yard scoring pass with 6:59 left in the third period.

The Huskies' fourth-ranked scoring defense in DII (10.0 ppg) limited the Warriors to 10 yards the rest of the way. ESU started at the BU 43 and its own 41 and 48-yard lines in the fourth quarter, trailing 20-13, but went three-and-out each time.

ESU led 6-3 midway through the second quarter, the Huskies' first deficit of the year, as R-Jr. K **Drew Reinhard** and Jon Koenig trading 26-yard kicks in the first quarter and Reinhard hit a career-long 40-yarder in the second. BU took its first lead 37 seconds later, as Domzalski broke a 38-yard run and Dan Latorre hit Cory Stiger for the TD from 29 yards out.

The Huskies extended their 10-6 halftime lead as Koenig hit a 49-yard field goal, then turned a fumble on the ensuing kickoff into a 27-yard touchdown run by Price with 10:20 left in the third. ESU forced four three-and-outs and had a fumble recovery on Bloomsburg's next five drives.

Sr. FS **Nicholas Artinger** had two interceptions in the second quarter to end a streak of 124 passes without a pick by Latorre. So. LB **Mike Bergey** had 11 tackles and R-Jr. OLB **Matt Freed** had 8 stops (2 sacks).

The Huskies had six sacks and forced four turnovers. ESU Fr. TB **Kendrick Williams** gained 106 all-purpose yards in his first career start.

KUTZTOWN – R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall** threw for 430 yards and hit R-Jr. WR **Ed Kiser** for the go-ahead touchdown in overtime, and ESU stopped KU QB Kevin Morton at the one-yard line on 4th-and-goal from the 10 as the Warriors pulled out a 27-20 victory.

The performances of Marshall (29-for-42, 41 yards rushing, 471 yards total offense) and Kiser (11 catches, 177 yards) were nearly overshadowed by Morton's 12 play, 80-yard fourth-quarter drive that tied the game with 19 seconds left. Morton threw for 52 yards and ran for 28, and hit Chris McCormick for a 13-yard TD. Kicker Matt Dineen, who was 13-for-14 on field goals in 2009, missed the PAT to force OT.

EAST STROUDSBURG – TB Thomas Beverly (31 carries, 170 yards) and QB Eric Anderkwavich (70 yards) powered the PSAC's top rushing offense and Anderkwavich threw for 232 yards and three TDs as C.W. Post earned a 42-24 victory.

The Pioneers (4-5, 4-2) fumbled seven times, losing five, on a rainy, windy day but managed to run for 236 yards and compile 468 yards of total offense. C.W. Post also had a pair of interception returns for TDs - Lou Scala tied the game at 21-21 with a 37-yard return in the second quarter and Peter Manns put the game away with a 44-yard TD with 2:59 left.

ESU (6-3, 3-3) ran out to a 21-14 lead at the end of a first quarter that seemed to set the tone for a fourth straight shootout between the schools. The Warriors struck first on a 21-yard run by Fr. TB **Kendrick Williams** in the first four minutes after a forced fumble and recovery by R-So. LB **Taylor Cave**, while C.W. Post came back with a long kick return and scored on a one-yard sneak by Anderkwavich.

Another fumble set up ESU's next scoring drive at the

22-yard line and R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall** cashed in with an 18-yard TD pass to R-Sr. WR **Sam Shuman**. The Pioneers once again returned the ensuing kickoff beyond midfield and Anderkwavich tossed a three-yard TD pass to Darnal Williams.

ESU took its final lead of the game, 21-14, with 2:03 left in the first on a 23-yard TD pass to R-Fr. WR **Jordan Hallman**. EAST STROUDSBURG – Freshmen **Eric Deery** and **Kendrick Williams** combined to run for 198 yards, R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall** threw for three TDs and ESU held Millersville to 227 yards of offense and forced four turnovers in a 44-3 win at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

Deery (18-102) and Williams (19-96, TD) helped ESU run for 243 yards on 47 carries. Marshall and R-So. QB **Ray Wagner** threw for 261 yards and four scores and the Warriors went over 500 yards of total offense for the third time this season.

The Warriors lead the PSAC with 26 takeaways and Jr. OLB **Mark Kalo** and R-So. CB **Shawnte Carroll** had their first career interceptions. R-Jr. DE **Jeff Case** had four tackles and three solo sacks.

ESU, ranked No. 8 in last week's NCAA Division II Super

Region One rankings, rolled up 23 points in the second quarter, including two TDs in 14 seconds midway through the period.

R-Jr. K **Drew Reinhard** made a 30-yard field goal with 30 seconds left to cap a 13 play, 64-yard march with Deery (5-36) and Williams (4-24) carrying the load. QB Bill Shirk drove Millersville for a 32-yard field goal by John Banzhof on the final play of the half.

ESU scored on its first two drives of the second half, on a 24-yard TD pass from Marshall to Fr. WR **Bryan Ogden** and a one-yard run by R-Jr. FB **Brent Jones** after drives that covered 65 and 57 yards. Wagner went 88 yards in four plays and hit Shuman for a 17-yard TD with 7:30 left in the fourth quarter.

Shuman had his fourth career two-TD game and Kiser went over the 1,000-yard mark in his career. R-Jr. OLB **Matt Freed** had seven tackles and finished the game with 101 tackles, becoming the first ESU player since Kevin Nagle (1998-2000) with consecutive 100-tackle seasons.

EAST STROUDSBURG – ESU scored on three of its first five offensive plays, the defense returned three interceptions for TDs and R-So. CB **Shawnte Carroll** set a school record with four interceptions, including two for scores, in a 54-28 win over Slippery Rock.

The win, combined with losses by Bentley (23-21 at Stonehill) and Bloomsburg (10-7 OT vs. Gannon), moved ESU to the No. 4 spot in the region.

The Warriors (8-3) stunned SRU (6-5) with 20 points in the first 4:23, including two TDs before the Rock ran an offensive play. ESU forced seven turnovers, intercepted SRU QBs Ryan O'Rourke and Rocco Colavecchia three times each and Carroll tied a DIJ record with three picks in the fourth quarter.

All-American R-Jr. OLB **Matt Freed** had a career-high 20 tackles (4.0 TFL, 2.0 sacks) and Sr. FS **Nicholas Artinger** had two interceptions, with a 45-yard return for a TD in the third quarter.

R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall** was 5-for-5 for 162 yards and threw 3 TD passes on consecutive plays in the first five minutes. He hit Fr. TB **Kendrick Williams** for a 22-yard score 1:05 into the game, hooked up with R-Fr. WR **Jordan Hallman** from 24 yards after SRU fumbled the kickoff, then struck again from 80 yards to R-Jr. WR **Ed Kiser** to close the barrage.

Slippery Rock scored on its next two possessions to make the score 20-14, on a two-yard run by Damarcus Cleckley and a seven-yard run by Ryan Lehmeier early in the second after a blocked punt.

ESU restored order with three scores to close the half, on a 47-yard run by Williams with 9:03 left, a six-yard toss from Marshall to Hallman and Carroll's first TD with 2:59 on the clock. Artinger's 45-yard TD ended SRU's first drive of the second half and Carroll clinched it with five minutes to go.

Marshall finished with 2,637 passing yards, the fourth ESU quarterback to hit the 2,500-yard mark, and Hallman had a career-high 102 yards and was the fifth ESU receiver with a 100-yard game.

Game 12 • Nov. 14 • Edinboro 31, ESU 16 NCAA Division II Playoffs • First Round

EAST STROUDSBURG – Trevor Harris was 28-for-39 for 298 yards and three touchdowns and cornerback Branden Williams had a blocked field goal and 61-yard return for a touchdown on the final play of the first half as Edinboro defeated ESU, 31-16, in the first round of the NCAA Division II Football Championship at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

Edinboro (9-3) advances to the second round of Super Regional One and will play No. 1 seed West Liberty on Saturday. The Fighting Scots handed the Hilltoppers their only loss of the season, 42-30, at Edinboro in their season opener August 29.

R-Jr. QB **Matt Marshall** was 15-for-26 for 301 yards and two touchdowns and ran for 59 yards for ESU (8-4), which had 452 yards of total offense but turned the ball over twice, missed one field goal and had another blocked.

The Warriors were making their fourth appearance in the NCAA Playoffs in school history following trips in 1991, 2004 and 2005 and are 4-4 all-time in postseason action.

Williams scored following a 46-yard field goal attempt at the end of the first half to give Edinboro a 17-13 halftime lead, and also had an interception in the first quarter. Harris threw a nine-yard TD pass to Shawn Walker on the Fighting Scots' first possession of the second half after a 63-yard kick return by Marcus Johnson.

Harris was 4-for-5 on the drive and broke former ESU quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger's PSAC record of 906 career completions. Harris finished the game with 916 completions in his 44th career game as a starter.

ESU pulled within 24-16 on a 27-yard field goal by R-Jr. K **Drew Reinhard** with 14 minutes left in the fourth quarter, but Harris went back down the field in four plays, capped by a 46-yard TD pass to Gary Nolen.

Nolen led Edinboro with 110 yards on three catches, tailback Michael Battles had seven catches for 45 yards and nine carries for 59 yards and Walker and Nick Marino pulled in scoring passes. Linebacker Greg Sondag had 11 tackles and a forced fumble at the five-yard line to stop an ESU drive in the first quarter.

R-Jr. WR **Ed Kiser** caught five passes for 121 yards for ESU and R-Sr. WR **Sam Shuman** had a 77-yard touchdown catch for the game's first score. Fr. WR **Bryan Ogden** also caught a TD pass for the Warriors. All-American linebacker R-Jr. OLB **Matt Freed** had 11 tackles (3.0 TFL) and two sacks, and finishes his junior season with 132 tackles (18.0 TFL) and 10 sacks.

Marshall had the sixth 300-yard passing performance in ESU's eighth NCAA Playoff game in school history and gained 360 yards of total offense. His 80-yard pass to Kiser in the first quarter is the longest in the Warriors' playoff history, and the 77-yard pass to Shuman tied the mark for the longest scoring play. Kiser had 188 all-purpose yards, fourth in ESU's postseason record book, and was the eighth Warrior to record a 100-yard receiving game.

Marshall finishes the season ranked sixth in school history in passing yards (2,938), total offense (3,251), TD passes (26) and quarterback rating (150.3) in a single season. Each number has been eclipsed only by four years from Terwilliger (2003-06) and Damian Poalucci's record-setting 1996 campaign.

Edinboro opened the scoring on a 32-yard field goal by Alex Romanias 4:52 into the contest, forcing a three-

and-out and capitalizing on a 44-yard pass from Harris to Nolen to set up the first three points.

ESU took a 7-3 lead just three plays later, as Marshall hit Shuman streaking down the sideline for a 77-yard score to give the Warriors' redshirt senior 2,043 career yards, becoming the eighth player in school history to eclipse the 2,000-yard mark.

Marshall went deep again on his next pass attempt after Edinboro punter Ryan Genco backed ESU up to its one-yard line. A play-action pass to Kiser cover 80 yards before Williams tracked him down at the 19, but the Warriors were unable to convert after a pair of runs by Fr. TB **Kendrick Williams** brought up first-and-goal to the eight. Marshall was hit by Sondag on a quarterback draw from the five-yard line and Kenny Pettis recovered to turn ESU away.

The Warriors went ahead 13-3 following a 14-play, 63-yard drive that erased 7:17 off the clock, their longest march of the year. Marshall ran six times for 29 yards and was 3-for-3 passing, finishing with a three-yard pass and spectacular one-handed grab by Ogden for the score on third-and-goal. Williams blocked Reinhard's extra point attempt to maintain the 10-point margin.

Reinhard missed a 37-yard attempt on ESU's next possession and Harris went 7-for-9 on Edinboro's ensuing drive. The Fighting Scots went 80 yards on 10 plays and Harris threw passes of 20 yards to Nolen and 17 yards to D'Mar Jeter before hitting Marino for a one-yard TD that made the score 13-10 with 41 seconds left in the first half.

Marshall took ESU from its 28-yard line to the Edinboro 29 in four plays, with completions of 18 yards to Kiser and 14 yards to Ogden and an 11-yard run, to set up a 46-yard field goal with four seconds left. Williams came off the edge to block the kick, scooped it up at the Edinboro 39-yard line and went the distance for a 17-13 halftime lead.

Both teams had just two possessions in the third quarter. Harris opened the period with his nine-yard TD pass to Walker after Johnson's long return of the opening kickoff. Kiser brought the ensuing kick back 43 yards to the Edinboro 49, but the Warriors were stalled and the Fighting Scots took 6:04 off the clock on a 12-play drive before punting it back to ESU.

The Warriors went to the ground game on their next possession to pull within 24-16. ESU ran it on eight of their first 10 plays, with Fr. TB **Eric Deery** running three times for 27 yards to open the drive and Williams and R-Jr. FB **Brent Jones** picking up first downs.

Marshall was knocked out of the game for the rest of the series on the next-to-last play of the third quarter, but R-So. QB **Ray Wagner** entered to convert a fourth down with a three-yard pass to R-Fr. WR **Jordan Hallman**. A pass interference flag on a throw to Shuman gave ESU the ball at the 11-yard line and Reinhard finished the 15 play, 77-yard march with a 27-yard field goal with 14:08 left.

Harris delivered the final big blow for the Fighting Scots two minutes later. He ran for 21 yards on the first play from the 30, then had a seven-yard rush before being sacked by Fr. DE **Kevon Brown**. Harris threw over the top on third down to Nolen, who outran the secondary for a 46-yard TD to make the score 31-16 with 12:01 left.

ESU took over at the seven-yard line with 6:13 left after an exchange of punts and drove into Edinboro territory, but Marshall's final throw of the day, a 15-yard completion to Hallman, came up one yard short of a first down to turn the ball over at the 42 with 3:24 remaining. Battle gained 51 of his 59 yards with a run up the middle to the four-yard line and Edinboro ran out the clock to finish the game.

FOOTBALL HISTORY

This will be the 83rd season for East Stroudsburg football teams as a four-year college. Over that time, the Warriors have had winning or .500 records in 60 of the 82 previous seasons, almost 75 percent of the time.

ESU teams have been selected to participate in the NCAA Division II football playoffs four times - 1991, 2004, 2005 and 2009. In 2005, the Warriors set a school record with 11 wins and advanced to the NCAA Division II semifinals for the first time in school history.

Football actually started for the East Stroudsburg Normal School in 1893, the same year the school was founded.

The first game was on Oct. 28, 1893, against the Hackettstown, N.J. Collegiate Institute.

Other games that first season were played against Harry Hillman Academy in Wilkes-Barre, Lackawanna Institute from Scranton, Blair Hall Academy and an Easton squad made up of athletes from the city and some of Lafayette College's star players.

In 1926, East Stroudsburg became a four-year college and the first intercollegiate football contest was scheduled.

Since then, the Warriors have:
 • Won 442 games, lost 282 and tied 19 for a .608 winning average, which ranks among the leaders among all NCAA Division II schools.

• Captured seven Pennsylvania conference championship trophies.

• Had only eight head football coaches, a record of continuity in its program unmatched by any other PSAC school.

The first unbeaten team was in 1942 under the late Gene Martin, head coach for 14 seasons from 1942-57. Other undefeated seasons were in 1965 under Jack Gregory, 1968 under Charlie Reese and 1975 and 1976 under current coach Denny Douds.

Nine other squads lost only one game apiece. The 1978 ESU team was 10-1 and scored one of the most one-sided victories in PSAC championship game history with a 49-4 romp over Clarion.

The Warriors competed in nine State Games for the conference title, winning five times and playing two ties. In addition, the 1942 and 1954 ESU gridiron squads won or shared mythical state college crowns.

A total of 27 players have earned All-America honors, including 11 in the last eight years. Linebacker Matt Freed has been a two-time All-American in 2008 and 2009 and punter Nick Krut was a consensus All-American following the 2008 season. Quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger, wide receiver Evan Prall, kicker Mark Brubaker, punter Ken Parrish and fullback Anthony Carfagno were honored in 2005, while Terwilliger and Prall repeated as All-Americans the following season.

ESU Athletic Traditions

Red and Black

The school colors go back to the first year of the Normal School in 1893. The Stroudsburg Times noted on September 28, 1893 that "the school colors are **Red and Black**. The school yell, "you will have to translate for yourself." The athletic teams were known as the Red and Black until 1932.

Origin of "The Warriors"

On April 8, 1932, a writer in The Stroud Courier, the campus newspaper, who signed her column, "Just Debs," noted: "The majority of colleges have nicknames for their athletic teams. This writer in the future is going to refer to the local teams as the **Warriors**." A new Warrior logo was adopted in 1996.

Murray was chosen in the sixth round (150th pick) in the 1988 NFL draft. He was a member of the Buffalo Bills' squad in 1988-99 and the New York Jets in 1990. He played in the World Football League in 1990-91. At ESU, Murray was four-time All-PSAC and is third in career tackles.

Ray Yakavonis (DE)

Yakavonis was chosen in the sixth round by the Minnesota Vikings (148th pick) in the 1980 NFL draft. He played five years with the Vikings from 1980-84 and one year with the Kansas Chiefs in 1985.

An AP and AFCA All-American in 1979, Yakavonis was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998. He is a former color commentator for the Warriors' radio football broadcasts and now coaches at King's College.

Top Free Agents

Mike Reichenbach (LB)

Reichenbach, an AP and AFCA All-American who led ESU to the PSAC championship game in 1983, played in the NFL for seven years. He played and started on the Philadelphia Eagles from 1985-89 and the Miami Dolphins from 1990-91. He was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

Mike Lush (DB)

Lush was an All-USFL safety for the Philadelphia-Baltimore Stars from 1983-85. He then played in the NFL for Minnesota in 1986, Indianapolis in 1987 and Atlanta in 1987-88. He had a school record 12 interceptions in 1980 and was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997.

Jim Villani (P)

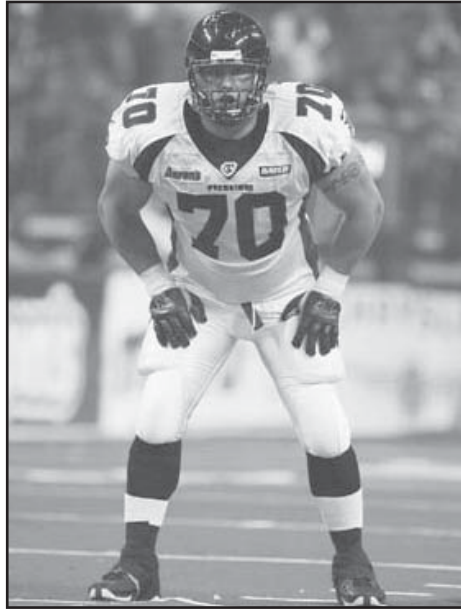
Villani was signed by the Seattle Seahawks in 1980. He was a member of the New Jersey General in 1983 and the Michigan Panthers in 1984, both of the United States Football League.

Mark Brubaker (K)

Brubaker signed with the Super Bowl champion Pittsburgh Steelers following a record-setting 2005 season. He was signed by the Steelers following the 2006 NFL Draft and played for the Rhein Fire in NFL Europa in the spring of 2007. He left ESU with PSAC records for extra points and scoring by a kicker and made 67 percent of his field goals.

Ken Parrish (P)

Parrish has spent the last two summers in training camp with the Philadelphia Eagles, initially signing with the team in May 2009. He was in camp with the San Francisco 49ers prior to the 2007 season. Parrish was an All-American in 2005 and is third in school history in season and career punting average.

Evan Prall (WR)

Prall attended minicamp with the Arizona Cardinals following the 2007 NFL Draft and signed with the New York Jets in late May. He was a member of the practice squad throughout the 2007 season. Prall set ESU records with 4,093 receiving yards and 5,682 all-purpose yards in his career.

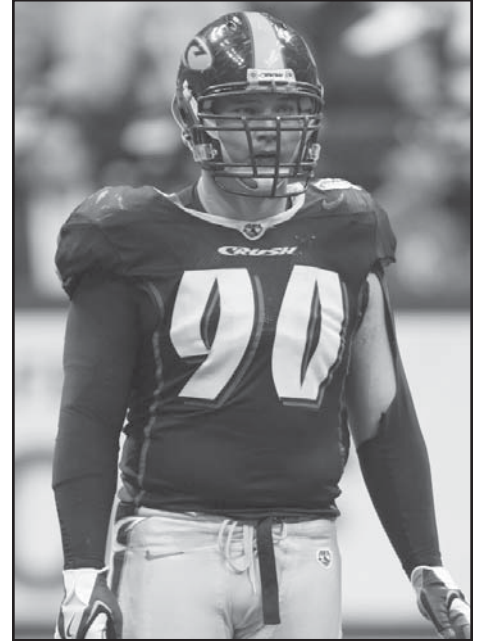
Arena Football

Dustin Barno (DT)

Barno, who spent time in the Tennessee Titans camp in 2003, was a five-year member of the Colorado Crush. He had 13 career sacks in the AFL, including a team record six sacks in 2005. Barno won an AFL championship in his second season with the Crush, helping the John Elway-owned team to a 51-48 Arena Bowl XIX win over the Georgia Force in Las Vegas in 2005.

Kevin Nagle (FB/LB)

Nagle joined former teammate Jim Sodano on the Orlando Predators and helped lead the team to Arena Bowl XX in 2006, where they lost to the Chicago Rush 69-61. Nagle played with Sodano for a season in Wilkes-Barre/Scranton in the AF2 before signing with Orlando. He ran for 152 yards and five touchdowns in 2007 for the Predators, who were coached by Jay Gruden, brother of Tampa Bay Buccaneers coach Jon Gruden. He joined the Colorado Crush prior to the 2008 season.

Jim Sodano (OL/DL)

Sodano joined Nagle to help give ESU representation in the Arena Bowl title game for the second year in a row in 2006. Sodano was an All-America linebacker for the Warriors and was signed by the Predators after spending time with the af2 Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Pioneers.

Other former Warriors who have seen time with the Pioneers include linebacker **Rich Butcofski**, defensive back **Brian Holkovic** and defensive tackle **David Dean**.

Other Pro Players

Will Burch, 1998 quarterback, **Greg Munch**, **Shepherd Alston** and **Dan Rounds**, **Joe DeLuise** and **Dan Crozier** have also played in the AFL2.

Other former ESU players competed in professional football leagues after graduation. Among them were **Grey Seamans (WR)** and **Dell Walker (TB)** in the CFL, **Justin Dettore (OL)**, **Joe Menton (LB)**, **Tim Green (LB)** and **Orlando Williams (TB)** also in the AFL, and **James Franklin (QB)** in Europe.
