ESU vs. Ferris State • 1st & 10

- 1 ESU travels to Ferris State for its 2018 season opener, and the first-ever meeting between the two schools.
- ESU's 2nd trip to Michigan, and 1st since falling 55-20 at Grand Valley State in 2005 NCAA DII semifinals (won only regional title in program history previous week).
- 2 ESU is 32-12 in season openers under head coach **Denny Douds**, and 57-32-1 (.639) all-time in season openers entering its 91st season of varsity football.
- ESU has won 9 of its last 10 openers since 2008 (won 20-16 at Fairmont State last year).
- **3** Douds leads active NCAA coaches in wins (263) and games coached (462).
- 7th in NCAA history in games coached
- 1st in DII history in games coached
- 4th in games coached at one school
- 16th in NCAA history in wins
- 1st in PSAC history in wins (set in 2008)
- 4 Douds begins his 45th season as head coach, ranking t-7th in NCAA history and ranking 5th in years coached at one school.
- 5 ESU is 10-24 vs. teams ranked in the AFCA DII Top 25 (since 2000)
- 1 ranked team in 2017 (at #6 IUP L 38-14)
- 1-11 vs. Top 10 teams (2005 W 52-39 at #2 Bloomsburg in NCAA Playoffs 2nd round)
- 0-11 in last 11 games vs. Top 10 teams
- 0-14 in last 14 games vs. ranked teams (W 14-11 vs. #25 Virginia Union in 2008 opener)
- ESU is 14-38 all-time vs. teams that qualified for the NCAA postseason the previous year

- **6** ESU returns 15 starts (7 offense, 8 defense) for 2018, including 3 who have been named All-PSAC East in their careers:
- R-Sr. TB Jaymar Anderson (2017 1st team) Sr. OL Michael Fleming (3x 2nd team) R-Sr. DL Marc Ranaudo (2016 1st team)
- ESU lost 5 former All-PSAC East selections, including all 3 senior linebackers
- 7 Fleming can become ESU's 11th 4-time All-PSAC East selection.
- 28 career starts last 20 at LT, first 8 at RT
- 2015 1st ESU FR OL named All-PSAC East since 1975
- **8** Anderson ran for 1,046 yards (6th at ESU) in his first season as a starter last fall.
- 3rd in PSAC and 1st in PSAC East (95.1 ypg)
- 6 100-yard games, including first 3 games
- 151 yards at IUP were most in first 13 games vs. Crimson Hawks before national semifinal
- 9 ESU was 5th in DII in takeaways (31) and 2nd in fumble recoveries (23) in 2017.

ESU - Denny Douds (Slippery Rock '63)

- career record of 263-196-3 (.573) in his 45th season
- 53rd season at ESU overall, including 8 years as an assistant coach from 1966-73
- 9 PSAC titles and 4 NCAA Playoff appearances since taking over in 1974
- outright state titles in 1975, 1978 and 1982 before the State Game was discontinued following the 1987 season
- PSAC East divisional titles in 1975, 1976, 1978, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1991, 2002 and 2003
- NCAA Playoff appearances in 1991, 2004, 2005 and 2009
- 2005 team won Northeast Region title and advanced to the national semifinals

Ferris State - Tony Annese (Alma '83)

- 60-14 record entering 7th season at Ferris State
- 4 straight NCAA DII Playoff appearances (won region 2016, regional runner-up 2017)
- consecutive GLIAC titles in 2014 and 2015 (school's first GLIAC crowns since 1999)
- 2016 won 47-32 at Grand Valley State in regional final (fell 35-20 at Northwest Missouri State in DII semifinal)
- 2017 fell 16-14 to Harding in regional final

ESU Football Adopts State-of-the-Art Helmet Sensor Technology to Better Monitor Player Head Impacts

Aug. 30, 2017

ESU's football program was the first in the PSAC to adopt Riddell's InSite Impact Response System - the latest in head impact monitoring technology from the world's leading helmet manufacturer. ESU was one of 12 programs, among 170 in NCAA Division II, to utilize InSite during the 2017 season. The helmets for every Warrior are equipped with InSite.

Riddell InSite is a football helmet-based sensor technology that alerts sideline staff when a player experiences a significant single impact or multiple impacts during a game or practice. The latest software – ISPM 3.0 – delivers more robust information about player head impacts including the location of the impact. It also offers new training opportunities based on data trends by player, and highlights East Stroudsburg's commitment to protecting its players not only through technique, but through technology.

"We are committed to using available technology to help keep our players as safe as possible on the field, both in practice and competition," said **Denny Douds**, ESU football head coach. "InSite allows our coaches and athletic trainers to have an extra set of eyes that helps them better monitor the action on the field. InSite also helps us identify players that are using less than optimal techniques and re-teach them. We feel this is an important investment in the health and safety of our football student-athletes here at ESU."

"The InSite helmet technology is another valuable resource that aids our athletic training staff in safeguarding our student-athletes," said **Colleen Shotwell, Ph.D., ATC**, ESU's coordinator of athletic training services. "The system provides objective measures of the impact and location of contact, which will allow us to more accurately monitor our student-athletes throughout their careers."

InSite was developed based on Riddell's Head Impact Telemetry System (HITS) and Sideline Response System (SRS), a technology that has analyzed more than 5 million impacts since 2003. This integrated technology fits into the liner of a Riddell helmet and is used to monitor players and alert the sideline to significant head impacts sustained during a football game or practice.

TWO TERWILLIGERS

- **Jimmy Terwilliger**, the 2005 Harlon Hill Trophy winner as a junior at ESU, is in his 4th year on the Warriors' coaching staff, and 1st year as associate head coach (he was defensive backs coach from 2015-17)
- He joins his father, **Mike Terwilliger**, ESU's offensive coordinator, on **Denny Douds**' staff
- Mike Terwilliger enters his 41st year as assistant coach after 4 years as ESU's starting QB from 1974-77 Douds' first 4 years as head coach
- Mike was a 2-time 1st team All-PSAC East selection, leading ESU to a 30-4-1 record, the 1975 PSAC championship (10-0) and a tie in the 1976 State Game (9-0-1)
- Jimmy was 36-12 in 4 years as ESU's starting QB from 2003-06 and is the only 4-time 1st team All-PSAC East QB in conference history
- He set 18 DII and 2 NCAA all-division records, tying the all-time mark with 148 career TD passes and setting DII records for passing yards (14,350) and total offense (16,064), among other standards.

GREGORY-DOUDS FIELD AT EILER-MARTIN STADIUM

- Field renamed to honor coaches **Jack Gregory** and **Denny Douds** after ESU's 58-14 win vs. Cheyney on Oct. 30, 2010
- Gregory had 49-11-2 (.806) record from 1959-65 and won 1964 and 1965 PSAC championships
- Douds has been ESU's head coach since 1974
- Eiler-Martin Stadium has been the home of the Warriors since 1938
- John R. Eiler was an outstanding athlete at the school in the early 1930s and later athletic director and a championship soccer coach
- Gene Martin was the Warriors' head football coach from 1942-57 and the school's long-time Dean of Men
- The Warriors have a 134-90 home record (.598) under Douds

Renovations include:

- New home bleachers were added in 1960
- The current press box was installed in 1988
- The track was resurfaced and expanded to 8 lanes in 2005
- Lights were added prior to the 2007 season
- FieldTurf was installed prior to the 2008 season
- Video board was upgraded prior to the 2014 season
- FieldTurf was replaced prior to the 2018 season

WARRIORS FROM 2000-09

- The Warriors had their winningest decade in school history in the 2000's, going 77-34 for a .694 winning percentage
- They had 9 winning seasons in 10 years, made 3 NCAA Playoff appearances (2004, 2005, 2009), won PSAC East titles in 2002 and 2003, and had a school-record 11 wins in 2005
- ESU has an all-time record of 479-332-19 (.589)

PSAC CHAMPIONSHIPS

- ESU has won a share of 9 PSAC titles under head coach Denny Douds, and 12 in school history
- The most recent championships came in 1991, 2002 and 2003, when the Warriors won the PSAC East championship

QB FAMILIES UNDER DOUDS

The Soltes (Matt and Andy), Terwilligers (Mike and Jimmy) and Marshalls (Brian and Matt) have all thrown TD passes for the Warriors under Douds.

Soltes

Andy Soltes' only career TD was a 73-yard pass to Scott Benoit that put the Warriors ahead in the 4th quarter of a 17-9 win at West Chester in 1982. He suffered an injury in the spring game the following year.

Matt's 5th career TD was a 33-yard pass to Tim Wilson to beat West Chester, 35-28, on October 6, 2012. Matt was a 3-time Harlon Hill Trophy candidate, finished t-5th in the national voting in 2015 and threw 126 career TD passes (2nd in PSAC history, t-2nd in DII history).

Terwilligers

Mike Terwilliger, ESU's offensive coordinator, was QB for Douds' first four years (1974-77) and has been an assistant coach ever since. He led ESU to a 30-4-1 record in 35 starts and threw 33 TD passes.

His son, Jimmy, ESU's associate head coach, was a 4-year Harlon Hill candidate from 2003-06, the 2005 Harlon Hill Award winner, and tied the NCAA all-division record with 148 TD passes. Jimmy was 36-12, starting all 48 games, and led the Warriors to the NCAA DII semifinals in 2005.

Marshalls

Brian Marshall was the Warriors' QB in 1981, under Terwilliger's tutelage, and threw $5\,\mathrm{TD}$ passes.

His son, Matt, was a two-year starter, led ESU to the 2009 NCAA Playoffs and threw 61 TD passes (4th in school history) from 2007-10.



Denny Douds, the all-time winningest coach in the history of the PSAC, is in his 45th season as head coach and 53rd year overall at ESU in 2018.

He is the winningest active coach in NCAA football with 263 career victories, following the retirement of Shepherd's Monte Cater following the 2017 season.

He ranks 16th in NCAA history in career wins and 7th in games coached (462), behind only John Gagliardi, Eddie Robinson, Amos Alonzo Stagg, Joe Paterno, Bobby Bowden and Pop Warner.

He ranks 10th in NCAA history in career wins at one institution.

Douds has reached numerous milestones for coaching success and longevity, and has spent 55 seasons in the coaching profession - including 52 at ESU, 44 as head coach and 8 as an assistant.

He is one of 15 men to reach 40 seasons as head coach in college football history, the 9th to coach 40 years at one school and the 5th to spend all of his 40+ year career at the same institution.

Douds set the NCAA Division II record for most games coached in 2011, surpassing Jim Malosky of Minnesota-Duluth (393 games) on October 22 against Millersville.

He set the PSAC record for career wins in 2008 with a 44-41 (OT) victory over Shippensburg, his 213th career victory, surpassing Gene Carpenter of Millersville.

Douds, the only PSAC coach who is an active member of the teaching faculty at his school (following the retirement of Slippery Rock's George Mihalik in 2015), was the recipient of ESU's Great Teacher Award in 2013.

He has coached 24 AP Little All-Americans, 6 AFCA All-Americans and 6 finalists for the Harlon Hill Award, including quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger, who won the award in 2005.

In his 44 years as head coach, Douds has mentored players who have combined for 196 1st team All-PSAC East selections. The Warriors have had 948 letterwinners with Douds as head coach, and an additional 151 players earned letters in his 8 years as an assistant coach from 1966-73. Including the numerous Warriors who were members of the team but didn't earn a letter, well over 1,000 players have contributed to the ESU football program during Douds' 52 years in the Poconos.

The Warriors have made 4 trips to the NCAA Playoffs under Douds, most recently in 2009. The 2000's featured a 77-34 record, 9 winning seasons, 3 NCAA Playoff trips and 2 PSAC East championships. ESU's 7 straight winning seasons from 2000-06 was the longest such streak of his career.

ESU made its 2nd and 3rd appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2004 and 2005, joining the 1991 squad which also advanced to the postseason. In 2005, the Warriors won three straight playoff games to claim the Northeast Region championship before bowing out in the national semifinals. ESU's 11-3 record set a school record for wins in a single season.

A native of Indiana, Pa., Douds was a high school coach in Erie, Pa. for two years and an assistant coach at West Virginia University for one year before accepting an assistant coach position at ESU.

He started as the Warriors' tight ends and linebackers coach under head coach Charlie Reese, and then became the team's defensive coordinator in 1968. After 8 seasons assisting Reese, Douds took over as the school's 8th head football coach in 1974.

Under Douds' direction, the Warriors have captured 9 PSAC Eastern Division titles with solo first-place finishes in 1975, 1976, 1978, 1982, 1983 and 1991 and ties for the top spot in 1980, 2002 and 2003. Before the PSAC championship game was eliminated in 1987, the Warriors won overall conference crowns in 1975, 1978 and 1982 and tied for the title with Shippensburg in 1976.

- Head coach Denny Douds is in his 56th year of coaching, and 53rd at ESU. He was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998.
- Assistant coaches Mike Terwilliger (1994), Frank Lupin (2002) and Jimmy Terwilliger (2017) are also members of the Hall of Fame.
- Terwilliger is in his 41st season as a football coach, all at ESU.
- Lupin is in his 58th year in coaching and 37th at ESU.

FAIRMONT, WV - R-Jr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** had 26 carries for 125 yards, Sr. WR **Tim Wilson** caught 4 passes for 84 yards and a TD and ESU's rebuilt defense held Fairmont State's offense to 9 points, all in the 1st half, for a 20-16 win.

ESU scored 17 straight points in a 14-minute span, covering most of the 2nd quarter and the early part of the 3rd, to lead 20-9 with just under 25 minutes left.

The only scoring in the remainder of the contest was an 8-yard interception return for a TD by Fairmont's Naiguan Thomas on ESU's 2nd play of the 4th quarter.

FSU, which was 10-2 overall and reached the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the first time in school history in 2016, drove inside the ESU 20 with less than 4 minutes left, but the Warriors held on 4th-and-6 from the 15 to turn the ball over on downs.

ESU managed to erase the final 3:49, gaining one first down by rush and another by a 15-yard facemask on 3rd-and-21, to seal the victory.

The defense forced 3 fumbles and held Fairmont to 197 yards on its final 9 possessions - the biggest chunk an 11-play, 86-yard drive that ended with a fumble at the ESU 12 on the first play of the 4th quarter - after FSU scored a FG and a TD on 2 of its first 3 possessions.

Anderson had ESU's 8th 100-yard rushing game in a season opener in its 44th year under Denny Douds, who leads active NCAA coaches in career games (452 - 8th all-time) and is 2nd among active coaches in career wins (261 - t-16th all-time).

R-Sr. QB **Tim DiGiorgio**, who started the final 4 games last year, was 10-for-28 for 168 yards, 1 TD and 3 Int., connecting with Wilson for a 10-yard go-ahead TD with 8:16 left in the 2nd quarter.

DiGiorgio found Wilson for 43 yards to the 1 on ESU's next drive, with So. FB **Wyatt Clements** plunging in for his first TD and a 17-9 lead with 3:49 left in the 1st half.

So. K **Jordan Walters** was 2-for-2 on field goals, hitting from 20 and 24 yards, in his debut for ESU.

JaJuan Young-Battle was 21-for-32 for 234 yards and carried 11 times for 57 yards to lead FSU. Terrell Charles (887 yards, 12 TD in 2016) had 41 yards.

Andre Hall (5 catches, 79 yards) and Shawn Harris (5 catches, 77 yards) paced FSU's receivers.

R-So. S **Justin Johnson** had a forced fumble and recovery in the 3rd quarter, and So. CB **Jamal Cooley** forced a key fumble that Sr. LB **Dakota Everett** recovered on the first play of the 4th quarter.

INDIANA, Pa.- Lenny Williams was 15-for-20 for 283 yards and 2 TD, leading No. 6 IUP to a 38-14 win vs. ESU at Miller Stadium.

R-Jr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** had 25 carries for 151 yards and both touchdowns for ESU, which won 20-16 at Fairmont State last week but couldn't pull the upset in its 2nd straight road trip to a 2016 NCAA DII Playoff team. IUP won 62-13 at Fairmont in last year's opening round.

Anderson has 51 carries for 276 yards and 2 TD thorugh the first 2 weeks, marking the 6th time in 44 seasons under head coach **Denny Douds** that an ESU back has consecutive 100-yard rushing games to start the year.

Williams, a 2-time Harlon Hill candidate who led DII in pass efficiency (214.0), yards per completion and yards per attempt as a sophomore in 2016, led an IUP offense that gained 607 yards - 283 passing and 324 rushing.

Duane Brown (17 carries, 137 yards, TD) and Samir Bullock (18 carries, 82 yards, TD), who ran for 200 yards in a 26-23 win vs. Ashland last week, were IUP's top rushers. Dom McNeil (5 rec, 101 yards, TD) and Allen Wright (5 rec, 80 yards, TD) led the receivers.

ESU dodged an early IUP threat after fumbling on its second play, as Dillon Sarka missed a 22-yard field goal after the Warriors' defense held. Sarka put the first points on the board with a 30-yard field goal with 5:33 left in the 1st quarter.

The Warriors responded to go ahead 7-3, covering 73 yards on 5 plays, with Anderson scoring on a 28-yard run. Anderson had 3 carries for 43 yards and Sr. WR **Tim Wilson** had both of his catches for 30 yards on the drive.

IUP scored 21 straight points in the 2nd quarter for a 24-7 halftime lead. Bullock scored on a 4-yard run (10 plays, 66 yards), J.R. Stevens had a 38-yard interception return for a TD and McNeil had a 69-yard TD catch to extend the lead to 17 with 1:41 left in the half.

IUP scored on the opening possession of the 2nd half to go ahead 31-7, running 10 plays for 85 yards, with Wright hauling in a 25-yard TD from Williams.

Anderson carried 6 times for 43 yards on ESU's ensuing drive (9 plays, 72 yards), finishing with a 1-yard TD run, to get the Warriors within 31-14.

IUP finished the scoring with a 22-yard run by Brown on the first play of the 4th quarter.

R-Jr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** had 22 carries for 131 yards and a TD, and R-Fr. QB **Ben Moser** was 13-for-31 for 196 yards in his 1st career start. He threw a 36-yard TD to So. WR **Elijah Rehm** which pulled ESU within 25-20 with 2:58 left, before Mercyhurst recovered an onside kick and ran out the remainder of the clock.

Anderson had his 3rd straight 100-yard game to open the season, joining Andre Castiglioni (2000 - 4 games), Pete Radocha (1976) and Robert Healy (2016) as the only Warriors to do that in 44 seasons under **Denny Douds**.He entered ranked 1st in the PSAC East, 3rd in the PSAC and 12th in DII (138.0 ypg) through the first 2 games.

Sr. WR **Tim Wilson** was Moser's top target, with 6 catches for 98 yards. Rehm had 3 for 50.

Owens had 15 carries for 133 yards in the 2nd half, replacing starter E'Andre Smith (13 carries, 60 yards, TD), who was injured early in the 4th quarter.

Doug Altavilla was 19-for-30 for 216 yards and 3 Int., but caught the go-ahead TD pass - a 61-yarder - from WR Brad Novak (3 catches, 34 yards) which gave Mercyhurst an 18-13 edge with 10:50 remaining.

The Lakers scored 25 straight 2nd-half points before Moser's TD pass to Rehm finished a 6 play, 72-yard drive.

ESU's defense forced 5 turnovers - interceptions by So. CB Andre' Gray, So. CB Jamal Cooley and R-Jr. FS Billy Inge III, and 2 fumbles, forced by Sr. LB Dakota Everett and Inge, and recovered by R-Sr. LB Sekou Jones and Jr. DE Mike Zakrzewski.

Everett had 2 blocked extra points, which appeared to be the difference before Novak's long TD pass to Altavilla one play after an ESU fumble following a long kick return.

So. K **Jordan Walters** was 2-for-3 on field goals, connecting from 29 yards on the first drive of the game and 27 yards early in the 2nd quarter. Anderson made it 13-0 with a 1-yard TD run, capping an 8-play, 58-yard drive after Inge's interception.

Mercyhurst was kept off the board until its 1st possession of the 2nd half, when Smith ran for a 20-yard TD. ESU led by that margin entering the 4th quarter, when Owens scored on a 53-yard run to cut it to 13-12 after a 6-play, 94-yard drive. Owens gave MU a 25-13 lead with a 5-yard TD run with 4:32 left. The Lakers held the ball for more than 22 minutes in the 2nd half.

EAST STROUDSBURG - Ryan Zapoticky was 24-for-30 for 370 yards and 2 TD, and Colin McDermott ran for 121 yards and 3 scores for Shippensburg in a 40-0 win.

Winston Eubanks caught both of Zapoticky's TD passes for his only 2 receptions, covering 121 yards - a 74-yarder in the 1st quarter for the first points, and a 47-yarder late in the 3rd quarter to close the scoring.

Zapoticky entered as the PSAC leader in total offense (336.7 ypg), and Eubanks was the PSAC leader and 6th in DII in receiving (138.7 ypg).

ESU suffered its first shutout since a 28-0 loss at Bloomsburg in 2000, a span of 183 games. R-Fr. QB **Ben Moser** was 23-for-44 for 247 yards and has yet to throw an interception in 75 attempts in his first 2 starts.

Sr. WR **Tim Wilson** had 5 receptions for 51 yards to lead 10 Warriors who caught at least one pass. Jr. TB **James Bell** added 3 catches for 45 yards.

R-Jr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** had 10 carries for eight yards after ranking 2nd in the PSAC and 12th in DII in rushing (135.7 ypg) through the first 3 weeks. He also had 3 catches for 20 yards.

Sr. LB **Dakota Everett** (11) and R-Sr. LB **Mike Wiand** (9) led the Warriors in tackles. R-Jr. DB **Mark Collins, Jr.** had an interception, the first against Zapoticky (10 TD, 1 Int.) this season.

Ship methodically built its lead, scoring 12 points in the 1st quarter, 14 in the 2nd and 14 in the 3rd, starting with the 74-yard TD pass to Eubanks 9:11 into the game.

McDermott had a 3-yard run to cap an 8-play, 54-yard drive late in the 1st quarter, and scored on a 15-yard run following a 12-play, 95-yard drive after Ship stopped ESU on downs inside the 5 in a 12-0 game.

Marcus Lominy had a 3-yard TD run with 26 seconds left in the 1st half, ending an 8-play, 65-yard march, for a 26-0 halftime advantage.

Ship received the 2nd-half kickoff and went 75 yards on 5 plays, with McDermott scoring from 16 yards, to make it 33-0. Zapoticky hit Eubanks for a 47-yard score with 1:53 left in the 3rd for the game's final scoring.

Ship gained 704 yards, 334 rushing on 50 carries, and 370 passing - all by Zapoticky, who had 422 yards total offense. S **Chase Ober** recovered an onside kick by So. **Jordan Walters**, who hit a 50-yard field goal in the 1st half.

The defense forced a 3-and-out and ESU took over at its own 2-yard line with 33 seconds left. Moser had a 36-yard pass to Wilson on the first play, then scrambled for 7 yards on 3rd-and-10 with ESU out of timeouts. A deep pass was intercepted as time expired but flagged for interference, giving ESU an untimed down from the 40, but David Simmons tracked down Moser for a sack.

Moser finished 16-for-33 for 240 yards and 3 TD, and R-Jr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** had 149 yards from scrimmage (13 carries, 119 yards; 1 reception, 30 yards). Wilson had 5 catches for 92 yards.

Paul Dooley had 272 total yards for WCU (166 passing, TD; 108 rushing, 2 TD). Jarel Elder, the PSAC East rushing leader, had 213 yards from scrimmage - 24 carries for 131 yards and a TD, and 2 catches for 82 yards. Tyler Karpinski had 9 catches for 44 yards.

WCU seemed to have the game in hand when Andrew Chegia capped an 8-minute drive with a 34-yard FG for a 31-6 lead with just under 4 minutes left in the 3rd.

WCU's final 5 possessions ended with a turnover on downs, fumble, punt, missed 20-yard field goal and another punt - and the ESU offense took advantage.

The 28-yard TD to Wilson made it 31-13 with 12:38 remaining, and after a WCU long drive but missed field goal, Moser led an 80-yard march culminating in a 22-yard TD to Buffalo to get it to 31-20 with 2:46 left.

Ober recovered the onside kick at the WCU 47, and Moser found Guarino for a 20-yard score with 1:43 left.

Anderson had his 5th 100-yard rushing game, and R-Sr. LB **Mike Wiand** had 14 tackles, 2.5 TFL and a forced fumble. ESU's largest comeback under Douds is 18 points, and largest halftime comeback is 14. The Warriors trailed by as many as 25, and by 22 at halftime.

LOCK HAVEN - R-Jr. TB Jaymar Anderson ran for 200 yards and 3 TD, leading ESU to a 37-27 win at LHU.

Anderson had the 12th 200-yard rushing performance in school history and registered ESU's 9th 1,000-yard rushing season. He carried 30 times, including a 43-yard TD on the 1st play from scrimmage.

ESU led 21-0 just over 10 minutes into the game before LHU scored a pair of TD to pull within 21-14.

The Warriors then scored 16 straight for a 37-14 advantage midway through the 4th quarter.

Anderson, 3rd in the PSAC East in rushing (92.7 ypg) entering the week, pushed his season total to 1,034 rushing yards, 7th-best in school history.

R-Fr. QB Ben Moser was 8-for-17 for 114 yards, a TD and an interception, throwing a 35-yard TD pass to R-So. WR Anthony Guarino in the 1st guarter.

Ralph Hyland had 27 carries for 165 yards and a TD, John Ford had 14 carries for 79 yards and a TD and freshman QB Kyle Knight was 18-for-34 for 264 yards and a TD, and ran for 47 yards and a TD, for Lock Haven.

The Bald Eagles gained 571 yards on 96 offensive plays, but had 4 turnovers, all lost fumbles.

ESU's defense, tied for 1st in NCAA Division II with 25 takeaways, extended its margin to 29 and pushed its DII-leading fumble recovery haul to 21.

R-Jr. TB Marguis Fells returned the opening kickoff 57 yards, and Anderson scored on a 43-yard run just 20 seconds into the game for the 6th opening play TD by the Warriors in 44 seasons under head coach Denny Douds.

Moser hit Guarino for a 14-0 lead, and R-Sr. LB Sekou Jones recovered a fumble in the end zone on LHU's next offensive play for a 21-0 score just 10:14 into the contest.

Anderson had a 4-yard TD that put ESU in front 27-14 with 2:13 left in the 1st half. He scored from 9 yards with 2:14 left in the 3rd for a 34-14 lead, and So. K Jordan Walters made a 30-yard field goal for a 23-point lead with 6:15 left. LHU tried to make it interesting, scoring with 4:27 and 2:36 remaining to close within 10, but the Warriors had their 4th takeaway after the Bald Eagles had taken over with 2:06 left.

Sr. WR **Tim Wilson** (3 catches, 27 yards) went over the 2,000-yard mark for his career. Anderson had his 6th 100-yard rushing game, one from ESU's season record.

EAST STROUDSBURG - Michael Keir threw for 350 yards and 2 TD, leading California to a 31-14 win over ESU in the 2017 finale at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

Luke Smorey had 10 receptions for 119 yards and a TD for the Vulcans (9-2), who were listed No. 9 in the NCAA DII Super Region 1 rankings last week. 5 of the top 8 schools lost this week, with a shake-up pending prior to the national field announcement and the region's top 7 seeds advancing on Sunday.

Keir completed 29-of-48 passes without an interception, leading a Cal offense that gained 491 yards on 78 plays. Jimmy Wheeler had 13 carries for 87 yards and a TD, and starter Jalen Bell had 11 carries for 43 yards in the first half.

R-Fr. QB Ben Moser was 21-for-41 for 180 yards, 2 TD and an interception and had 12 carries for 53 yards for ESU. R-Jr. TB Jaymar Anderson caught an 18-yard TD pass from Moser and finished with 30 total yards, with 7 carries for 12 vards.

Anderson finishes the season with 1,046 rushing yards, 6th-most in school history. He had 30 carries for 200 yards and 3 TD in last week's 37-27 win at Lock Haven.

R-Jr. TB Marquis Fells had 6 catches for 53 yards and So. WR Elijah Rehm had 4 catches for 49 yards and a TD late in the 4th guarter, R-Fr. TB Devante Robinson had 3 carries for 46 yards.

Sr. LB Dakota Everett had 12 tackles, finishing with 101 stops on the season. R-Sr. Mike Wiand and R-Sr. Sekou Jones finished with 83 and 81 tackles, respectively, as ESU's top three tackles.

R-Jr. FS Billy Inge III had a forced fumble early in the 2nd quarter, his 6th of the season, to tie the school record set by R-So. S Justin Johnson earlier this fall. Inge finishes with 6 forced fumbles in 9 games (0.67), expected to be the national statistical leader through the end of the season. Johnson, who did not play Saturday due to injury, had 6 in 10

Sr. WR Tim Wilson closes his career with 133 catches (11th at ESU) for 2,042 yards (13th) and 16 TD. He had 53 receptions for 821 yards and 4 TD this fall after posting 58 catches for 910 yards and 8 TD as a junior.

R-Sr. C Devon Ackerman made his 44th consecutive start, becoming the 5th ESU player in the last 15 years to start every game of his career - joining QB Jimmy Terwilliger and WR Evan Prall (48 - 2003-06), OL Mike Habel (46 - 2004-07) and OL Dan Caffrey (45 - 2008-11).

So. CB Andre' Gray had 6 pass breakups, closing the year with 13 passes defensed 2 interceptions, 11 pass breakups).

Moser was 105-for-220 for 1,299 yards, 8 TD and just 3 interceptions in 7 starts. Anderson averaged 95.1 rushing yards per game, and Wilson averaged 74.6 receiving yards per game, accounting 12 of ESU's 20 offensive touchdowns. Fells averaged 26.4 yards on kick returns, 10th-best in school history, and 13.4 yards on punt returns, ranking 6th.
