ESU vs. Lock Haven • 1st & 10

- 1 ESU hosts Lock Haven in the PSAC East opener for both schools. The Warriors (1-2) have a comeback 41-34 win vs. Seton Hill sandwiched between road losses at No. 8 Ferris State (49-17) and Edinboro (49-24). Lock Haven (0-3) lost 45-0 at DI FCS Duquesne, 30-21 vs. Clarion and 59-17 last week vs. No. 3 IUP.
- 2 Last time out: ESU trailed 42-3 through 3 quarters before scoring 3 4th-quarter TD at Edinboro last Saturday.
- LHU trailed 42-3 at halftime in its loss to IUP.
- 3 R-Sr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** leads the PSAC in rushing (153.5 ypg) through 3 weeks.
- Anderson has played in 2 games after missing season opener due to injury
- 32 carries, 239 yards, 6 TD vs. Seton Hill
- 21 carries, 68 yards at Edinboro
- 239 rush yds vs. Seton Hill 4th-most at ESU (4th-most rush yds in DII this season)
- 6 rush TD tied PSAC record, set ESU record (most rush TD in DII this season)
- 6 total TD one from ESU and PSAC records
- 2nd career 200-yard game
- 7th career 100-yard game (in 13 starts)
- 4 Anderson had 30 carries, 200 yards and 3 TD in last year's 37-27 win at Lock Haven.
- ran for 1,046 yards (6th at ESU) in his first season as a starter last fall.
- 3rd in PSAC and 1st in PSAC East (95.1 ypg)
- 6 100-yard games, including first 3 games
- 151 yards at IUP were most in first 13 games vs. Crimson Hawks before national semifinal

- 5 ESU's Denny Douds leads active NCAA coaches in wins (264) and games coached (465).
- 7th in NCAA history in games coached

- 2015 1st ESU FR OL named All-PSAC East since 1975
- 9 Sr. WR Jylil Reeder ranks 2nd in PSAC and 1st in PSAC East in receiving (112.0 ypg).
- 6 rec, 176 yds, 2 TD last week at Edinboro
- **10** ESU had the top 2 players in DII in forced fumbles per game in 2017.

THE SERIES: ESU leads, 12-7

- Warriors are 4-1 since LHU moved to PSAC East in 2013 (Seton Hill added to PSAC West)
- ESU has won 8 of last 9 overall, including 37-27 last year at LHU
- series dates to 1926, ESU's first season of varsity football (99-0 win remains program record)
- before its 66-41 win in 2016, LHU's most recent victory was 1989 (17-7)
- ESU won non-conference games in 1999, 2006, 2007 and 2012 prior to LHU moving to PSAC East

DOUDS MILESTONES

- Douds is one of 13 men to reach 40 seasons as head coach in NCAA football history
- 9th to coach 40 years at one school
- 5th to spend all of his 40+ year career at the same institution:

55 years - Eddie Robinson, Grambling (1941-42, 45-97)

50 years - John E. Dorman, Upper Iowa (1905-06, 09-42, 45-59)

46 years - Joe Paterno, Penn State (1966-2011)

45 years - Denny Douds, ESU (1974-present)

40 years - Jim Malosky, Minn.-Duluth (1958-97)

- 1st in career wins (264) among active NCAA coaches [16th all-time]
- 1st in career games (465) among active NCAA coaches [DII record 7th all-time]
- PSAC record for career wins

THE LAST MEETING

2017 • ESU 37, Edinboro 27

LOCK HAVEN - R-Jr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** ran for 200 yards and 3 TD, leading ESU to a 37-27 win at LHU.

Anderson had the 12th 200-yard rushing performance in school history and registered ESU's 9th 1,000-yard rushing season. He carried 30 times, including a 43-yard TD on the 1st play from scrimmage.

ESU led 21-0 just over 10 minutes into the game before LHU scored a pair of TD to pull within 21-14.

The Warriors then scored 16 straight for a 37-14 advantage midway through the 4th quarter.

Anderson, 3rd in the PSAC East in rushing (92.7 ypg) entering the week, pushed his season total to 1,034 rushing yards, 7th-best in school history.

R-Fr. QB **Ben Moser** was 8-for-17 for 114 yards, a TD and an interception, throwing a 35-yard TD pass to R-So. WR **Anthony Guarino** in the 1st quarter.

Ralph Hyland had 27 carries for 165 yards and a TD, John Ford had 14 carries for 79 yards and a TD and freshman QB Kyle Knight was 18-for-34 for 264 yards and a TD, and ran for 47 yards and a TD, for Lock Haven.

The Bald Eagles gained 571 yards on 96 offensive plays, but had 4 turnovers, all lost fumbles.

ESU's defense, tied for 1st in NCAA Division II with 25 takeaways, extended its margin to 29 and pushed its DII-leading fumble recovery haul to 21.

R-Jr. TB **Marquis Fells** returned the opening kickoff 57 yards, and Anderson scored on a 43-yard run just 20 seconds into the game for the 6th opening play TD by the Warriors in 44 seasons under head coach Denny Douds.

Moser hit Guarino for a 14-0 lead, and R-Sr. LB **Sekou Jones** recovered a fumble in the end zone on LHU's next offensive play for a 21-0 score just 10:14 into the contest.

Anderson had a 4-yard TD that put ESU in front 27-14 with 2:13 left in the 1st half. He scored from 9 yards with 2:14 left in the 3rd for a 34-14 lead, and So. K **Jordan Walters** made a 30-yard field goal for a 23-point lead with 6:15 left. LHU tried to make it interesting, scoring with 4:27 and 2:36 remaining to close within 10, but the Warriors had their 4th takeaway after the Bald Eagles had taken over with 2:06 left.

Sr. WR **Tim Wilson** (3 catches, 27 yards) went over the 2,000-yard mark for his career. Anderson had his 6th 100-yard rushing game, one from ESU's season record.

ESU Football Adopts State-of-the-Art Helmet Sensor Technology to Better Monitor Player Head Impacts

Aug. 30, 2017

ESU's football program was the first in the PSAC to adopt Riddell's InSite Impact Response System - the latest in head impact monitoring technology from the world's leading helmet manufacturer. ESU was one of 12 programs, among 170 in NCAA Division II, to utilize InSite during the 2017 season. The helmets for every Warrior are equipped with InSite.

Riddell InSite is a football helmet-based sensor technology that alerts sideline staff when a player experiences a significant single impact or multiple impacts during a game or practice. The latest software – ISPM 3.0 – delivers more robust information about player head impacts including the location of the impact. It also offers new training opportunities based on data trends by player, and highlights East Stroudsburg's commitment to protecting its players not only through technique, but through technology.

"We are committed to using available technology to help keep our players as safe as possible on the field, both in practice and competition," said **Denny Douds**, ESU football head coach. "InSite allows our coaches and athletic trainers to have an extra set of eyes that helps them better monitor the action on the field. InSite also helps us identify players that are using less than optimal techniques and re-teach them. We feel this is an important investment in the health and safety of our football student-athletes here at ESU."

"The InSite helmet technology is another valuable resource that aids our athletic training staff in safeguarding our student-athletes," said **Colleen Shotwell, Ph.D., ATC**, ESU's coordinator of athletic training services. "The system provides objective measures of the impact and location of contact, which will allow us to more accurately monitor our student-athletes throughout their careers."

InSite was developed based on Riddell's Head Impact Telemetry System (HITS) and Sideline Response System (SRS), a technology that has analyzed more than 5 million impacts since 2003. This integrated technology fits into the liner of a Riddell helmet and is used to monitor players and alert the sideline to significant head impacts sustained during a football game or practice.

- **Jimmy Terwilliger**, the 2005 Harlon Hill Trophy winner as a junior at ESU, is in his 4th year on the Warriors' coaching staff, and 1st year as associate head coach (he was defensive backs coach from 2015-17)
- \bullet He joins his father, Mike Terwilliger, ESU's offensive coordinator, on Denny Douds staff
- Mike Terwilliger enters his 41st year as assistant coach after 4 years as ESU's starting QB from 1974-77 Douds' first 4 years as head coach
- Mike was a 2-time 1st team All-PSAC East selection, leading ESU to a 30-4-1 record, the 1975 PSAC championship (10-0) and a tie in the 1976 State Game (9-0-1)

GREGORY-DOUDS FIELD AT EILER-MARTIN STADIUM

- Field renamed to honor coaches Jack Gregory and Denny Douds after ESU's 58-14 win vs. Cheyney on Oct. 30, 2010
- Gregory had 49-11-2 (.806) record from 1959-65 and won 1964 and 1965 PSAC championships
- Douds has been ESU's head coach since 1974
- Eiler-Martin Stadium has been the home of the Warriors since 1938
- John R. Eiler was an outstanding athlete at the school in the early 1930s and later athletic director and a championship soccer coach
- Gene Martin was the Warriors' head football coach from 1942-57 and the school's long-time Dean of Men
- The Warriors have a 135-90 home record (.600) under Douds

Renovations include:

- New home bleachers were added in 1960
- The current press box was installed in 1988
- The track was resurfaced and expanded to 8 lanes in 2005
- Lights were added prior to the 2007 season
- FieldTurf was installed prior to the 2008 season
- Video board was upgraded prior to the 2014 season
- FieldTurf was replaced prior to the 2018 season

WARRIORS FROM 2000-09

- The Warriors had their winningest decade in school history in the 2000's, going 77-34 for a .694 winning percentage
- They had 9 winning seasons in 10 years, made 3 NCAA Playoff appearances (2004, 2005, 2009), won PSAC East titles in 2002 and 2003, and had a school-record 11 wins in 2005
- ESU has an all-time record of 480-334-19 (.588)

PSAC CHAMPIONSHIPS

- ESU has won a share of 9 PSAC titles under head coach Denny Douds, and 12 in school history
- The most recent championships came in 1991, 2002 and 2003, when the Warriors won the PSAC East championship
- Overall PSAC titles came in:
- 1942, 1954, 1964, 1965, 1968, 1975, 1976, 1978 and 1982
- ESU has a 220-131-1 (.626) record in PSAC games for the 3rd-best winning percentage since the first on-the-field title was awarded in 1960

ESU IN THE NCAA PLAYOFFS

- ESU has played in the NCAA Division II Playoffs four times, most recently in 2009 when they fell to Edinboro, 31-16, in the first round
- The Warriors have also played in the postseason in 1991, 2004 and 2005, when they advanced to the national semifinals
- ESU has a 4-4 record in four postseason trips

AND WE GO TO...OVERTIME

- ESU is 4-7 all-time in overtime contests
- Win vs. Shippensburg in 2008 (44-41) gave head coach Denny Douds the PSAC record with his 213th career victory

QB FAMILIES UNDER DOUDS

The Soltes (Matt and Andy), Terwilligers (Mike and Jimmy) and Marshalls (Brian and Matt) have all thrown TD passes for the Warriors under Douds.

Soltes

Andy Soltes' only career TD was a 73-yard pass to Scott Benoit that put the Warriors ahead in the 4th quarter of a 17-9 win at West Chester in 1982. He suffered an injury in the spring game the following year.

Matt's 5th career TD was a 33-yard pass to Tim Wilson to beat West Chester, 35-28, on October 6, 2012. Matt was a 3-time Harlon Hill Trophy candidate, finished t-5th in the national voting in 2015 and threw 126 career TD passes (2nd in PSAC history, t-2nd in DII history).

R-Jr. QB Tyler Soltes, Matt's brother, is ESU's long snapper.

Terwilligers

Mike Terwilliger, ESU's offensive coordinator, was QB for Douds' first four years (1974-77) and has been an assistant coach ever since. He led ESU to a 30-4-1 record in 35 starts and threw 33 TD passes.

His son, Jimmy, ESU's associate head coach, was a 4-year Harlon Hill candidate from 2003-06, the 2005 Harlon Hill Award winner, and tied the NCAA all-division record with 148 TD passes. Jimmy was 36-12, starting all 48 games, and led the Warriors to the NCAA DII semifinals in 2005.

Marshalls

Brian Marshall was the Warriors' QB in 1981, under Terwilliger's tutelage, and threw $5\,\mathrm{TD}$ passes.

His son, Matt, was a two-year starter, led ESU to the 2009 NCAA Playoffs and threw 61 TD passes (4th in school history) from 2007-10.



ESU Head Coach Denny Douds • 45th Year • Career Record: 264-198-3 9 PSAC titles

4 NCAA Playoff appearances 2005 Northeast Regional title



Denny Douds, the all-time winningest coach in the history of the PSAC, is in his 45th season as head coach and 53rd year overall at ESU in 2018.

He is the winningest active coach in NCAA football with 263 career victories, following the retirement of Shepherd's Monte Cater following the 2017 season.

He ranks 16th in NCAA history in career wins and 7th in games coached (462), behind only John Gagliardi, Eddie Robinson, Amos Alonzo Stagg, Joe Paterno, Bobby Bowden and Pop Warner.

He ranks 10th in NCAA history in career wins at one institution.

Douds has reached numerous milestones for coaching success and longevity, and has spent 55 seasons in the coaching profession - including 52 at ESU, 44 as head coach and 8 as an assistant.

He is one of 15 men to reach 40 seasons as head coach in college football history, the 9th to coach 40 years at one school and the 5th to spend all of his 40+ year career at the same institution.

Douds set the NCAA Division II record for most games coached in 2011, surpassing Jim Malosky of Minnesota-Duluth (393 games) on October 22 against Millersville.

He set the PSAC record for career wins in 2008 with a 44-41 (OT) victory over Shippensburg, his 213th career victory, surpassing Gene Carpenter of Millersville.

Douds, the only PSAC coach who is an active member of the teaching faculty at his school (following the retirement of Slippery Rock's George Mihalik in 2015), was the recipient of ESU's Great Teacher Award in 2013.

He has coached 24 AP Little All-Americans, 6 AFCA All-Americans and 6 finalists for the Harlon Hill Award, including quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger, who won the award in 2005.

In his 44 years as head coach, Douds has mentored players who have combined for 196 1st team All-PSAC East selections. The Warriors have had 948 letterwinners with Douds as head coach, and an additional 151 players earned letters in his 8 years as an assistant coach from 1966-73. Including the numerous Warriors who were members of the team but didn't earn a letter, well over 1,000 players have contributed to the ESU football program during Douds' 52 years in the Poconos.

The Warriors have made 4 trips to the NCAA Playoffs under Douds, most recently in 2009. The 2000's featured a 77-34 record, 9 winning seasons, 3 NCAA Playoff trips and 2 PSAC East championships. ESU's 7 straight winning seasons from 2000-06 was the longest such streak of his career.

ESU made its 2nd and 3rd appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2004 and 2005, joining the 1991 squad which also advanced to the postseason. In 2005, the Warriors won three straight playoff games to claim the Northeast Region championship before bowing out in the national semifinals. ESU's 11-3 record set a school record for wins in a single season.

A native of Indiana, Pa., Douds was a high school coach in Erie, Pa. for two years and an assistant coach at West Virginia University for one year before accepting an assistant coach position at ESU.

He started as the Warriors' tight ends and linebackers coach under head coach Charlie Reese, and then became the team's defensive coordinator in 1968. After 8 seasons assisting Reese, Douds took over as the school's 8th head football coach in 1974.

Under Douds' direction, the Warriors have captured 9 PSAC Eastern Division titles with solo first-place finishes in 1975, 1976, 1978, 1982, 1983 and 1991 and ties for the top spot in 1980, 2002 and 2003. Before the PSAC championship game was eliminated in 1987, the Warriors won overall conference crowns in 1975, 1978 and 1982 and tied for the title with Shippensburg in 1976.

COACHING STAFF NOTES:

- Head coach Denny Douds is in his 56th year of coaching, and 53rd at ESU. He was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998.
- Assistant coaches Mike Terwilliger (1994), Frank Lupin (2002) and Jimmy Terwilliger (2017) are also members of the Hall of Fame.
- Terwilliger is in his 41st season as a football coach, all at ESU.
- Lupin is in his 58th year in coaching and 37th at ESU.

Aug. 30 • #8 Ferris State 49, ESU 17

BIG RAPIDS, Mich. - Jayru Campbell threw for 204 yards and 2 TD, and ran for 100 yards and a score, in the 1st half to lead No. 8 Ferris State to a 49-17 win over ESU.

R-So. QB **Ben Moser** was 19-for-42 for 234 yards, a TD and 2 interceptions, R-So. TB **Devante Robinson** ran for 38 yards and a TD and had 4 catches for 47 yards, and Sr. WR **Jylil Reeder** had 7 catches for 84 yards and a TD as ESU opened its 45th season under **Denny Douds**.

Campbell played the 1st half at QB for Ferris State, which entered 45-7 with 4 consecutive NCAA Division II Playoff appearances since 2014, including the 2016 regional title and 2017 regional runner-up.

Campbell threw a 44-yard TD pass to Dion Earls (5 catches, 114 yards, 2 TD) just under 3 minutes into the game, then had a 5-yard rushing TD, and DaShawn Thrower had a 51-yard fumble return for a TD as Ferris State led 21-0 after the 1st quarter.

The Bulldogs added 3 more TD in the 2nd quarter and led 42-3 at halftime.

Moser threw a 3-yard TD pass to Reeder to complete a 7-play, 53-yard drive midway through the 3rd quarter, and Robinson cashed in with a 1-yard TD run after an interception by Jr. CB **Andre' Gray** and 37-yard pass to Reeder midway through the 4th quarter.

Ferris State gained 649 yards, 389 rushing and 260 passing. Campbell's 100-yard effort was joined by backup QB Travis Russell (8 carries, 79 yards, TD; 5-for-7 passing, 56 yards) and Marvin Campbell (6 carries, 61 yards, TD).

Sr. P **Sam O'Brien** had 11 punts for a 39.5-yard average, including 5 inside the 20, for the Warriors.

Robinson added 4 kick returns for 72 yards for 157 all-purpose yards, including 85 yards from scrimmage.

Ferris State led the GLIAC in total offense (423.7 ypg), rushing offense (223.3 ypg), total defense (281.1 ypg), rushing defense (117.5 ypg), pass efficiency defense (92.6) and 3rd down defense (26.3) during a dominant 2017 campaign.

Douds entered the season as the winningest active coach in NCAA football with 263 victories. He goes to 263-197-3 in his 463rd game.

Sept. 8 • ESU 41, Seton Hill 34

EAST STROUDSBURG - R-Sr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** ran for 239 yards and tied a PSAC record with 6 rushing TD, including 4 in the 4th quarter, as ESU rallied past Seton Hill, 41-34, in the home opener at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

Anderson's 239 yards, 4th-most in school history, came on 32 carries. He broke ESU's single-game rushing TD record of 4 held by 6 players, most recently all-time leading rusher Robert Healy at Mercyhurst in 2016.

His 6 total TD are 2nd-most in school history behind Jon Schnaars' 7 receiving TD - 4 in regulation and 3 in OT - in a 69-67 (50T) loss vs. Shippensburg.

Anderson is the 2nd ESU player with 2 200-yard rushing games, coming in his 12th career start, after going for 200 yards and 3 TD in a win at Lock Haven last fall. He had his 7th 100-yard rushing game. Andre Myers previously had 2 200-yard games in 1998.

ESU trailed 27-13 entering the 4th quarter before scoring 28 straight points to jump in front.

Anderson gave the Warriors a 34-27 lead with a 28yard TD with 5:08 remaining, and added his 6th TD with a 5-yard score with 3:08 left after an interception and 56-yard return by R-Sr. FS **Billy Inge III**.

Seton Hill, which dropped its 16th straight, pulled within 41-34 on a 13-yard TD from Ryan Barabe (18-41, 326 yards, 2 TD, Int.) to Cinque Sweeting, completing an 8-play, 94-yard drive with 1:45 left, but ESU recovered the ensuing onside kick and ran out the clock.

Sweeting (19 carries, 118 yards, TD; 2 catches, 13 yards, TD), Ardell Brown (6 catches, 139 yards after 6 for 164 and 3 TD at Virginia Union), Kinan Humphrey (4 catches, 121 yards, TD) and Logan Wiland (10 carries, 82 yards, 2 TD) led Seton Hill.

R-So. QB **Ben Moser** was 16-29 for 226 yards and ran 8 times for 36 yards. Sr. WR **Jylil Reeder** (3 catches, 76 yards) and R-So. TB **Devante Robinson** (7 catches, 72 yards; 4 carries, 33 yards) helped pace ESU.

Anderson had 20 carries for 180 yards through 3 quarters, then added 12 for 59 yards and 4 TD in the 4th quarter. A 45-yard pass from Moser to Reeder on the 3rd play of the 4th quarter, setting up Anderson's 4-yard TD run, started the comeback. ESU forced two 3-and-outs, and Inge's interception led to the insurance TD.

EDINBORO - Ta'Nauz Gregory had 11 catches for 162 yards and 2 TD and threw for another, and Walter Fletcher ran for 110 yards and 3 TD to lead Edinboro to a 49-24 win at Sox-Harrison Stadium.

Sr. WR **Jylil Reeder** had 6 catches for 176 yards and two touchdowns, hauling in scoring passes of 33 and 57 yards in the 4th quarter, to lead ESU.

Andrew Tomko was 22-for-35 for 282 yards, 2 TD and 2 interceptions, and caught a 25-yard TD pass from Gregory for the game's first points for Edinboro (3-0), which led 35-3 at halftime and 42-3 midway through the 3rd guarter.

ESU had 3 4th-quarter TD from R-So. QB **Ben Moser**, who was 17-for-39 for a career-high 311 yards but threw 5 interceptions, part of a 6-turnover day for the Warriors.

R-Sr. TB **Jaymar Anderson** had 21 carries for 68 yards for ESU in his 2nd game of the season, after posting 32 carries for 239 yards and a PSAC record-tying 6 TD in last week's comeback 41-34 win over Seton Hill to earn D2Football.com Offensive Player of the Week honors

Fletcher (20 carries, 110 yards, 3 TD), 2nd in DII with 158.9 rushing yards per game last season, added 3 catches for 34 yards. He was complemented by Kyle Galak (12 carries, 132 yards; 3 receptions, 45 yards), who had a 77-yard TD for the game's final points with just under 2 minutes left.

Gregory's 59-yard TD catch from Tomko gave Edinboro a 35-3 lead with 37 seconds left in the 1st half, and his 12-yard TD made it 42-3 on Edinboro's 2nd possession of the 2nd half.

Moser threw 4th-quarter TD to R-Jr. WR **R.J. Sarajian** (3 catches, 41 yards) and two long TD to Reeder.

So. S **Andrew Brown** and R-Sr. FS **Billy Inge III** had 2nd-half interceptions for ESU.
